What a deal, right? So what are you waiting for? Get your SnoBall tickets right away.

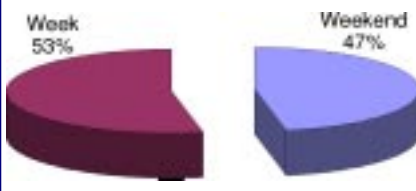

You may sign-up only yourself and one other member for a trip. If you are not participating in the trip you may sign up 2 members. See paragraph on membership requirements. This paragraph will apply to anyone signing up other people who cannot attend in person.

The doors to the Garden Room will not open until 6:00 pm. Inside the meeting room deli style numbers will be available for each trip that is opening that night. You must stay in the room until your number is called and you sign up for your designated trip. The bar will be open and we will make every attempt to have the trip leaders available to take sign-ups earlier than 8:30 pm.

Fall Foliage Hike '09

Early October is almost here. Time for crisp temperatures, golden leaves, flannel shirts — and, of course, Fall Line's annual one-day Fall Foliage hike.

On Saturday, Oct. 9, Mike Gramsammer will lead a group of hikers to the Blue Rocks campground near Allentown, PA. From there the group will hike one of two routes along the Appalachian to the "Pinnacle", a scenic viewpoint boasting a 1,000-ft. vertical elevation. At the end of the day, the group will gather for a Pennsylvania Dutch dinner at Haag's, a popular local restaurant.

Here are the details:

The trail: The hike begins at the Blue Rocks geological formation. From there, hikers can take either the 3.5-mile round trip or the 5.5-mile round trip option. Both trails

have an elevation gain of 1,000 vertical feet en route to the scenic "Pinnacle". Just below the summit, there are two caves that can be explored. Be advised that parts of the trail are steep, rocky and strenuous.

The meeting place: Weather permitting, the group will meet at 8 a.m. in the rear parking lot of the Radisson Hotel on Rt. 73 in Mount Laurel. They'll carpool approximately 2 hours before meeting at the campground at 10 a.m. in the Blue Rocks campground lot. At camp, there will be a nominal trail hike fee.

What to bring: Lunch, daypack, and flashlight. Hiking shoes are mandatory: no sneakers!

Rain date: Sunday, Oct. 10.

Children: You can bring them, as long as they have strict adult supervision and are dressed in proper hiking attire.

Heart of Camden iii: if you come, we will build it

If you listen closely, you can already hear the sound of hammers, shovels and electric drills emanating from a familiar place. But where?

Oh, right. South Camden. Of course.

On Saturday, Sept. 25, Fall Line will continue its tradition (!) of carpooling into Camden for a glorious fun-filled day of rehabbing old homes for Heart of Camden, the nonprofit housing organization that models itself after Jimmy Carter's Habitat for Humanity.

In its over 10 years of existence, Heart of Camden has been purchasing and rehabbing over 110 homes and turning them over to dozens of low-income families. Heart of Camden holds the mortgage and charges no interest so that working families who desperately need affordable housing can experience pride of ownership as they help reclaim a neighborhood.

Here's your chance to get involved again.

For the better part of a morning and early afternoon, we'll work side-by-side with other Fall Line and Heart of Camden volunteers. We'll thrill to the joys and challenges of hands-on housing rehabilitation while doing our part to help restore a ravaged South Camden neighborhood one house at a time.

This is Fall Line's third invitation from Heart of Camden. Last fall and spring, Fall Liners demolished walls, installed new windows, built a stockade fence, cleaned a basement, installed a new roof, removed graffiti and painted an entire house, to name just a few tasks.

So what's in store for Sept. 25? We don't know yet. It could be anything from light demolition, hammering nails, sheet rock installation, yard cleanup, spackling and painting—whatever has to be done to prepare a house for eventual occupancy. Be prepared for anything.

You might be asking yourself: Is there any beer involved?

Silly question. Of course. When the day is done, we'll regroup at P.J. Whelihan's in Westmont for an afternoon of revelry over wings and beer. Traditions will be honored—the volunteer judged to be the grimmest of the bunch will be eligible for a very special prize.

Interested? Look for Harry Gould or Janice Lynch at the next few regular Fall Line meetings. We will be taking sign-ups as soon as you read this. No special skills? Not to worry. As we said last year, if you can swing a hammer or hold a paint brush, you're hired. Or just tell us what you'd like to

do, and we'll do our best to find a task to match your skills and comfort level.

Tools? Bring whatever you've got; we may need them (or, then again, we may not). Work gloves? Definitely. Professional power equipment? Check with us first. Make sure you wear old clothes and hard-soled work shoes.

One more thing: Pack a sandwich and something to drink for lunch.

If you go: We'll meet at the Bishop Eustace Prep School parking lot in Pennsauken at 9 a.m. (or an alternate location if Eustace schedules a home football game that day). From there, we'll carpool caravan-style into South Camden, arriving at a predetermined housing site around 9:30 a.m. There, volunteers will be assigned to one of two housing sites, the number depending on how many Fall Liners sign up.

We'll break for lunch around 12 noon. Somewhere between 1 and 2 p.m. we'll knock off and head back to the Eustace parking lot and continue on to P.J. Whelihan's for serious liquid refreshments and bragging rights.

So please come and join Janice Lynch and yours truly on Sept. 25. Look for our sign-up table on Sept. 7 and 21 for directions and other details.
