Return to Okemo, Vermont

January 9-11, 2004

Come one, come all!!!! Dust off the skis and sign up for the fabulous, weekend trip to Okemo, Vermont. On Friday, Jan 9th we will depart from Barclay Shopping Center at 6:00 pm sharp to the highly-rated Okemo mountain.

Accommodations will be at the Best Western in Ludlow. The hotel is only 1 short mile from the slopes and within walking distance to many of Ludlow's restaurants, bars and shops. The Best Western will provide a daily, continental breakfast, including pastries, fruit, juice and coffee. Each room comes equipped with a refrigerator and microwave oven.

For anyone who has never been to Okemo, you will have a great experience. For those who have been to Okemo, there have been numerous changes since last season. Okemo is a great place for beginning skiers as well! Okemo boasts "Incredible Terrain - Legendary Conditions", with 95% snowmaking coverage, Southern Vermont's highest vertical of 2,150 ft., a modern lift system and a vast trail network of steeps, glades, and bumps comprising over 600 acres, Okemo is **Big** mountain skiing and riding. There is also two Super Pipes, four terrain parks, long intermediate cruisers and gentle terrain for novices.

Some facts on Okemo slopes and

trails: 113 slopes, trails and glades; Novice 31% (36 trails); Intermediate 43% (48 trails); Advanced and Expert 26% (29 trails); Base Elevation: 1,144 feet; Summit Elevation: 3,344 feet; Longest trail: 4 ? miles (Mountain Road).

Okemo has 18 lifts, including 9 quad chairs (5 highspeed detachable quads), 3 triple chairs and 6 surface lifts.

New for 2003/2004 season: Okemo has put \$55 million into the newer Jackson Gore Mountain, Jackson Gore area. It now offers a total of 14 trails with four lifts (including two high speed detachable quad chairlifts) and an entirely new base lodge and resort center. The new

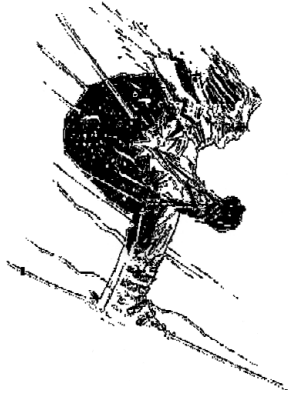

Coleman Brook Express high speed detachable quad chairlift begins just outside the Jackson Gore Inn's front door and will whisk guests to a trail location above the existing Jackson Gore Express quad. Seven new trails encompassing 40 acres (including a 9,600-foot long novice run that runs from top to bottom of the mountain peak) have been added this year. The Stargazer Carpet, 400 foot-long carpet lift has been installed on the gentle terrain in the base for beginners.

The Jackson Gore Base Lodge features plenty of dining options for skiers and riders. The Roundhouse, a 390-seat food court is located on the first floor of the new lodge. The Vermont Pizza Co., a 280-seat pub and lounge specializing in wood fired pizzas, is situated on the second floor above The Roundhouse. Coleman Brook Tavern will provide full service dining for guests from dawn to dusk. Some of Jackson Gore Base Lodge features include: Snow Stars Learning Center, Ski/Snowboard Shop, equipment rental/repair shop, administrative offices and video arcade. All of the walkways surrounding the new base area are heated for more effective snowmelt during the winter months.

Trip cost: \$319 on Oct 7th. After that the price changes to \$339. The trip includes bus ride (with supply of beer, wine and soda), accommodations, and 2-day lift ticket. This trip will sell out fast, so come and sign up on Oct 7th!!
