ENGELBERG, SWITZERLAND

"THE MOUNTAIN OF ANGELS" MARCH 3-11, 2006

Did you miss the fantastic trip to Grindelwald in March? Well, if you did and even if you were on that stupendous trip, don't miss out on this voyage to the historic town of Engelberg, Switzerland. Engelberg is only 1 1/2 hours from Zurich, and is translated from German into "The Mountain of Angels", for it could have definitely been the work of angels if we consider the beauty and majestic view of the mountains and glaciers. Steeped in history, yet thoroughly modern, Engelberg offers all the comfort and skiing challenges modern skiers such as us expect and would demand from a first-class resort. Engelberg offers 25 various cable transportation systems and 60 miles of skiing. **The famous "Kings Run" starting at 10,000 feet of Mt. Titlis (no I did not make up the name!) to Engelberg at 3,500 feet** which is very famous and one of the most beautiful runs of the Alps, just a mere 7.5 miles long!

The scenery here is so striking that Engelberg built the world's first **REVOLVING** gondola! Gawk as you ascend the mountain while the lofty summits scroll by. The panorama includes the St. Gotthard Pass, Lake Lucerne and even the Bernese Oberland beyond Interlaken!

Founded as a Benedictine monastery in 1120, Engelberg is Switzerland's oldest holiday resort. This fairytale town straddles two mountain ranges offering contrasting ski

terrain. **Want sun?** The Bruni area has sunny, south-facing slopes that appear as a field of dreams for cruisers. **Want challenge?** On the other side of town, advanced skiers can carve till the summer cows come home on the steep slopes of Mt. Titlis.

Titlis offers more than **6,000 vertical feet** of snow-covered glacier and twisting forested runs with spectacular views of the village at the end of the corduroy snow. Have lunch in the Panorama Restaurant at the top before you start on your journey back to town.

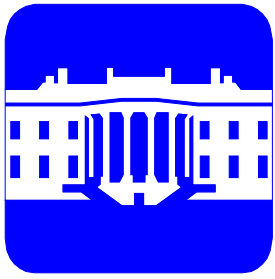
But lovers of the slopes would be mistaken not to explore this age-old village. The main cruising street is Dorfstrasse (town street), with great bars and restaurants. You will also find the usual array of glitzy shops selling fine watches and Swiss army knives, located next to mouthwatering pastry shops.

Take a break and visit the Benedictine monastery a few blocks away, which has been rebuilt and is one of only five in Switzerland. Its baroque-type church houses the largest pipe organ in Switzerland. There are also cheese-making demonstrations from which you can sample (Yum!) and buy. Nearby is the Valley Museum located in a 1786 farmhouse. There is even a (eh hem) casino in town.

If that is not enough, there are cross-country and winter hiking trails, dog sledding, horse drawn sleigh rides and a 2-mile toboggan run. And, back up on the slopes, there is lift served tubing. And also, the lovely town of Lucerne is only 22 miles away (a short, pleasant train ride).

FALL LINE RETURNS TO TAOS

February 25 to March 4, 2006

Fall Liners returning from the Taos trip a few years ago raved about the trip, with spectacular ski conditions, suburb lodging, great food and drink, and of course, great company. If you were jealous of listening to all of those wonderful stories of powder and mountainside lodging, here's your chance to experience it yourself. Fall Line Ski Club returns to Taos from February 25 to March 4, 2006 for an encore performance.

When you think of New Mexico, skiing may not come to mind right away. However, driving north out of Albuquerque and into the mountains, you will find Taos Ski Valley, a skier's paradise which averages over 300 inches of annual snowfall and over 300 days of sunshine. This mountain has something for everyone (except snowboards, which are not permitted at Taos) from first time skiers to experts, with 1,294 acres of skiable terrain on 110 trails and a vertical drop of 2,612 ft. The mountain is serviced by 4 quad chair lifts, 1 triple chair, 5 double chairs, and 2 surface lifts, providing convenient access to all parts of the mountain. Those looking for an additional thrill can hike up to the top of Kachina peak for some steep, fresh powder.

We will be staying at the luxurious Inn at Snakedance, located just 10 yards from the lift! Imagine a week without carrying skis or waiting for a shuttle bus. Imagine being able to go back to your room in the middle of the day to change clothes or equipment, and not missing any skiing. Imagine being able to sleep in a little longer each day and still get first tracks. The Inn at Snakedance captures the spirit of the old west. It completely remodeled recently, upgrading and modernizing guest rooms. The inn has all the amenities you would expect, including sauna, hot tub, exercise room, ski locker with boot dryers, satellite TV in the room, and an award winning restaurant and bar.

Taos is world renowned for its ski school. Whether you are an absolute beginner or hardened expert, the ski school is a great way to improve your skiing. Specialty classes include Mogul Mastery, Telemark Skiing, and Race Clinics. 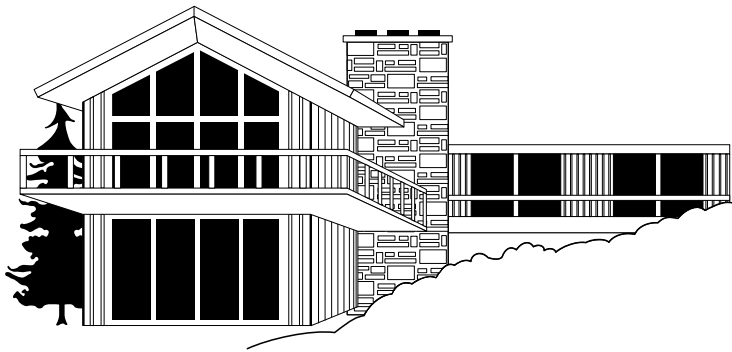
The Lion King
