Fall Line Wins the Dragon boat Gold!

You've heard about the Fall Line Dragon boat team for months now, well the Dragon boat Race Festival for 2008 has come and gone and Fall Line has come out winners. For those that have been under a rock (or not reading this newsletter) a dragon boat is a long thin boat with a dragonhead and a tail that holds 20 paddlers (preferably all paddling in the same direction), a drummer who sits on the bow of the boat drumming the timing of the strokes and a steering person who stands in the back of the boat. Eight boats race at a time (trust me, with 8 drummers all going at once gets a bit noisy and sometimes confusing).

Over 150 teams show up real early on Saturday October 4th. This proved too early for some of the team members who found

themselves either running for the boat, or on the shore for the first race. Some of us still needed our first cup of coffee by the first race so we were off to the slowest race of the day with a time of 2:40, not bad, but we all knew we could do better.

The time for the first race puts all the teams in groups of 16 from A to I. We were in category E. In the semifinal race we all felt better about our performance, but only cut off a few seconds for a time of 2:38, but more importantly, we came in first which meant we were in the finals, going for gold. As we returned back to the dock the banks of the river were all cheering, which they usually do, but we knew we didn't paddle that well. We all turned around to find that one of our competitors had misjudged the balance of their boat and while crossing the finish line actually swamped the boat. Everyone got out safely so it just made for further entertainment of the day. I know I heard at least one person scream to the captain that they should have gone down with the ship.

The final proved that all 8 teams were well matched. With a dragon head on every boat it was literally neck to neck for the entire race. As we crossed the finish line most of us could not tell if we had come in first, second or third. We were all stunned when several Fall Liners met us at the dock to tell us that they had unofficially announced us as the winners. We did not believe it and stood by the results board until they officially posted the results. Not only did we win, but we had our best time ever with 2:33. Rumor has it, that time was the 29th fastest of all division finals including the "professional" teams that practice several days a week.

CONCLUSION

Since there was no article in October's Newsletter, I guess you thought we had either drowned or quit our quest. NOT! It's just that I was swamped with too many work and play demands to write and deliver an article before the deadline. What follows is our story as it unfolds again on Saturday, August 23rd.

Since we were getting closer to Trenton, this would be our last weekend of camping. As it turned out, we should have bagged the camping or found another location. Ask Sofia or John Kennedy about the details. All I'm going to say is that we ran into an ignorant clan from North Jersey who thought camping meant blasting rap music and trolling the woods screaming in a foreign language until 4:00 am. I was exhausted and somehow slept thru it all. Others were not so fortunate. However, when they started up again at 6:00 am I finally lost it and almost started a cultural civil war! We flipped them 14 birds on the way out. We should have mooned them as well.

This weekend we would start up again below the Delaware Water Gap, and paddle past Easton on our way to the northeast corner of Bucks County. Although this section sounds as if it would be boring, it was anything but. It contained some interesting rapids and many bridges (11), a big city, boulders where the glaciers once ended, and the entrances to both the Delaware Canal (PA) and the Delaware & Raritan Canal (NJ). The weather once again was perfect, and except for Saturday night's "party", all went as planned. By the end of the weekend we had completed 168 miles since beginning in late May.

A 5th and final weekend was planned for Sep 6th-7th. Initially, I was concerned about low water levels since Summer 2008 had been unusually dry. This was not to be the case however as we were finally trumped by Hurricane Hanna. There were thoughts of paddling the entire weekend, but I was concerned that I would end up paddling Saturday alone in the wind and rain if the storm progressed too slowly. So we postponed Saturday's stage from Upper Black Eddy to Lambertville until Sunday. It turned out to be a glorious cool blue-sky day with a swollen swift river beneath us. In fact, the flow was so strong that we made the best time of our entire adventure clocking 4.6 MPH – even with a leisurely day on the river. However, we did have one casualty (flipped kayak) and almost a second. Both paddlers recovered embarrassed and unscathed. We finished the day with a two hour binge at the local pub on the Jersey side of the river in Washington's Crossing. Nine days and 187 miles completed.

We rescheduled our final stage for Sep 27th but Sunday was looking better. We decided on Sunday. It rained anyway. Hard. Thunder! Lightening! And only 5 brave souls willing to weather the storm. At least the river was high again – so much so that we managed to paddle through the last two obstacles – Wells Falls and Scudders Falls with relative ease since most of the boulders were submerged. With only 15 miles to paddle this day went fast.

We finally reached the tidewater just below the "Trenton Makes – The World Takes" bridge. We continued on for another ¼ mile to our final takeout on the banks of the river below the Trenton Thunder Ball Park. We were soaked. It was still raining. However, dry clothes, burgers and beers were waiting at Kat-Man-Du. It was warm and toasty inside and I was with my kayaking buddies. It doesn't get any better than that.

Statistics: In 10 days of paddling we traveled 202 river miles (1769 total miles), spent a total of 58 hours on the river averaging 3.5 MPH. We paddled for 52 of those hours averaging 3.9 MPH. We counted about 50 bald eagles – mostly in the upper 90 mile stretch of the river. We passed under 42 bridges along the way while negotiating 307 rapids – 11 of which were Class II or above. It rained very little – except for the first and last ½ hours of the 1st day and much of the last day. We camped 6 nights. We traveled endless miles shuttling cars. Although I loved every day (even in the rain), the river is more beautiful with every mile you travel back upstream – especially the uppermost 45 miles. The best rapids are between mile markers 45 and 75.

And finally, thanks again to all who participated in this year's adventure: Steve Rapp, Dennis Realley (official trip photographer), Juan Carro, Steve "GOP" Lange and Brandy the Wonderdog (she does the dog paddle), Russ and Janice Wortham, Peggy Sloan (who provided valuable kayaking tips), rookies Sofia Dobkin Kennedy and John Kennedy, newcomer Jerry Biedenbach, Mr and Mrs Chris (Nast), Dave Friedman, Bob Suravage, Evelyn Hallman, John "Old Man" Steel, Olga Sharma, "Blacktoe" Bob Homan, and the Nast kids and friends.

Awards: Steve Rapp and Dennis Really for completing the entire 202 miles, Dennis again as rookie of the year (he first took up kayaking in March), Juan (father of the year for skipping 2 stages to work on his daughter's house at her request), and kayaker of the year – Barack Obama.

Keep an eye out for December's online and paper newsletters. Photos will be forthcoming along with our challenging plans for 2009!

Needs Volunteers

Do you know what EPSC means? It means Eastern Pennsylvania Ski Council which is the parent body of your ski clubs.

We run events, trips and sell vouchers and probably are best known by your racers for the Council Cup the last Sunday in February.

In order to pay for many of those activities, we need more than the dues each club pays. To keep the cost of dues down, we run a fund raiser called EPSC Winterfest Auction – Fund Raiser. It is Nov. 14, 2008 this year at Williamson’s Restaurant.
