# SUGARBUSH 09

On February 6-8, 2009, Fall Line returns to one of the top ski resorts in the State of Vermont. Sugarbush is known as a terrific natural skiing mountain with an average annual snowfall of 262". Covering more than 4000 acres over 6 mountains and 508 skiable acres there is plenty of terrain for all levels of skiers. 20% is labeled for beginners, 45% for intermediate skiers and 25% black diamond and double black diamond. A 23,000 square-foot day lodge features cathedral ceilings, a food court and the Castlerock Pub complete with an outdoor patio and barbeque area. For those wanting more formal dining the Timbers, a post-and-beam restaurant attached to nearby residences, offers upscale cuisine. Sugarbush was featured on The Today Show last February with the entire broadcast team getting a taste of the mountain and its amenities.

Beginners will enjoy the terrain at Lincoln Peak with several magic carpets and a beginner double. For those who enjoy the cruisers, Mt. Ellen boasts some of the east's best terrain with over 2600 vertical feet of pure corduroy cruising. Those looking for steep terrain or a bump run can check out FIS and Black Diamond, or Exterminator, Cliffs, Stein's (yes, *Stein Eriksen was the director of the Sugarbush ski school from 1964 to 1968*), Tumbler, Hammerhead and Twist.

Located less than a mile from the base of Lincoln Peak and easily accessible by shuttle bus, the Sugarbush Inn combines the charm and hospitality of a country inn. You can relax in the library or enjoy a chat by the sitting room fireplace. The floors creak and the fires crackle but the Inn features gracious rooms with private baths and cable TV. Breakfast and access to the Health & Racquet Club (located nearby) with an indoor pool, Jacuzzi, sauna, massage & more are included with every stay. Casual dining is available in the evenings at the on-site Grill Restaurant.

- Bus transportation leaving from Cherry Hill (with beer, wine, soft drinks and water), resort shuttle service
- Two night's accommodations at the Sugarbush Inn
- Two buffet breakfasts
- Two day lift ticket and membership at Sugarbush Health and Racquet Club

A special thanks to Janice Lynch for all her help in keeping the \$'s, Brad Land for his work with the food and of course Steve Archibald for the use of his back yard.

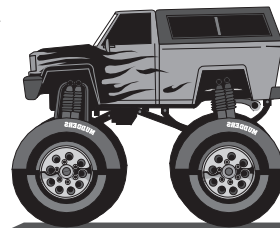

## Ski Stowe Super Bowl Weekend

Spruce Peak is geared toward beginner and intermediate skiers and riders. Little Spruce- the area nearest the Spruce base Lodge- is a great place to learn, while Big Spruce is the next step up.

Some Stowe Facts:

- Stowe offers top-to-bottom runs with groomed cruisers, bump runs, and some really fine glade skiing.
- The infamous front Four (Starr, Goat, National and Lift Line) are arguably the most exciting runs in the East.
- For the novice skiers and riders, there's an entire mountain (Spruce Peak) criss-crossed with easygoing runs.
- And with the longest average trail length in New England, be prepared to spend some time on the mountain.
- Eight person gondola that whisks skiers from bottom to top in a blazing seven and a half minutes.

The Stowe Mountain Road Shuttle offers free transportation to get you around. The shuttle runs from 7 AM till 10 PM regularly between Stowe Village and resort with abundant stops along the way.

Other things to do after or instead of skiing:

Dog sledding, snow shoeing, cross country skiing, snow mobiles. Stowe is blessed with some of the best terrain and snow conditions in the east for these activities. Ben and Jerry's ice cream factory (14 miles), Cabot Dairy Farm (28 miles), or spa at Topnotch (1/2 mile), are also a short distance from the lodge.
