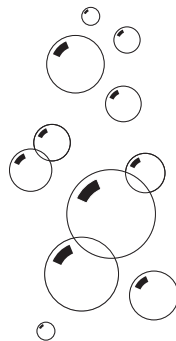
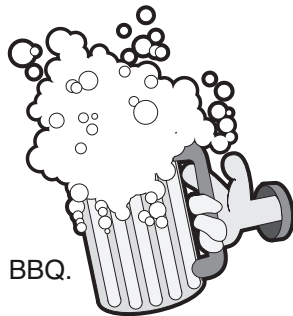

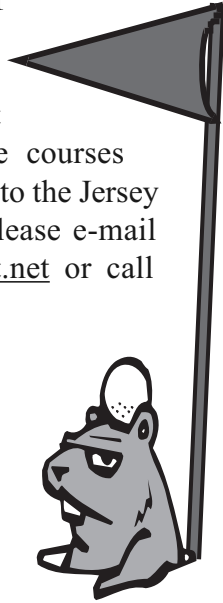

Anyone up for golf?

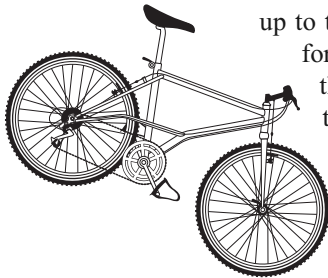

BIG SKY MONTANA

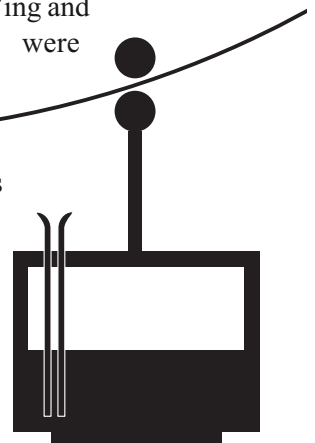

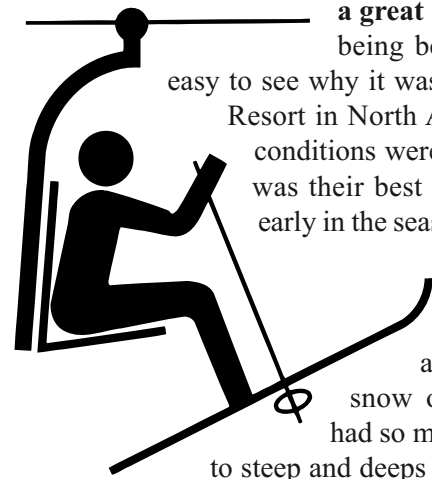


there to pick us up in minutes.

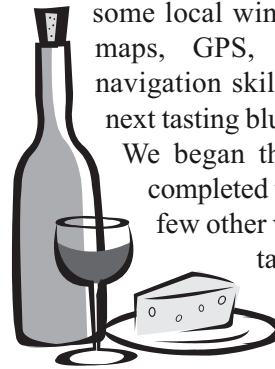
All in all it was a fantastic trip!!
