Jackson Hole, Wyoming

Opening at the July 17 mixer meeting is Fall Line's much-anticipated trip to Jackson Hole Mountain Resort in February 2019. The early sign-up price is \$1,669, which includes round-trip transportation on American Airlines between Philadelphia International and Jackson Airports, round-trip motor coach transportation between Jackson Airport and the hotel, 7 nights lodging at the Rustic Inn in the town of Jackson, with a full Buffet Breakfast each day, and a 5-out-of-6-day lift ticket for Jackson Hole. There will also be a complementary welcome reception at the hotel.

The Rustic Inn Creekside Resort & Spa is Jackson's luxury boutique hotel. It is located on twelve acres adjacent to the National Elk Refuge and four blocks from the town square in Jackson Village. Accommodations at the hotel will be in the private cabins.

Amenities at the hotel include a lounge with full bar and wine cellar selections; a Bistro with locally-sourced, seasonal dinner menus; an outdoor heated pool, Jacuzzi

and sauna; a full service spa with eucalyptus steam room; a fitness center that is open 24/7; outdoor fire pits; laundry facilities; a ski storage area and complimentary wi-fi. There is daily ski shuttle service to Jackson Hole that leaves the Rustic Inn lobby at 8:00 am and 9:30 am, with the return trip leaving the mountain at 3:00 pm and 4:30 pm.

Jackson Hole Mountain Resort boasts a 4139 ft vertical from a base elevation of 6311 ft. There are 2,500 skiable acres inbounds with another 3,000 acres of backcountry for the more adventurous. There are 133 named trails including 50% expert, 40% intermediate and 10% beginner, with 12 lifts including the gondola and the aerial tram. Of note, Jackson Hole expands the typical green/blue/black/double black trail designations to include double blues.

Last season, Jackson Hole received an astounding total snowfall of 502 inches (compared to 455 for Whistler/Blackcomb and 389 for Squaw). Check out www.jacksonhole.com for more information.

SNOWMASS/ASPEN COLORADO TRIP FEBRUARY 23RD TO MARCH 2ND

Ski first tracks daily in fresh powder or on freshly groomed corduroy FREE with your lift ticket but reservations are required. The morning run is led by a member of the mountain operations or by a member of the Ski and Snowboard school team. Also available is an Aspen Mountain powder tour on the backside of the mountain. Fresh tracks guaranteed and a gourmet lunch included. I am inquiring as to the cost.

We will be staying in the Stonebridge Inn again this year where you will find a mini fridge and a coffee maker for those magic brown beans. A daily full buffet breakfast will have you ready for an awesome day of skiing. The inn also has a heated outdoor pool and hot tubs for all our sore muscles. Well at least my sore muscles, lol.

The Snowmass/Aspen area has 4 mountains which should please all levels of skiers and snowboarders. Black diamond slopes are also available at Aspen Highlands with a 360 degree view available from Maroon Bells. Snowmass has 93 trails, 21 lifts and 3,332 acres offering terrain for every taste. There are free RFTA busses running to Aspen and the other ski resorts that stop just outside the Inn.

They are offering an early bird discount on ski equipment rental if you book more than 7 days in advance. They offer free overnight storage and transfer for all 4 mountains if you rent from them. With the cost of airline charges for your skis this might be an attractive option. Your lift ticket covers all 4 epic mountains, Snowmass, Aspen Highlands, Aspen Mountain and Buttermilk.

If you want a different adventure there is cross country skiing, snow shoeing and horseback riding available. If you want to be pampered, visit the spa at Snowmass or Aspen.

EASTERN PENNSYLVANIA SKI COUNCIL WINTER CARNIVAL AT MT. BACHELOR JANUARY 26TH TO FEBRUARY 2ND

Bend Oregon, it's where you go to play! Life is an adventure, let's take this one together! I've been told that Bend, Oregon is where you go to play. So, bring out the child in you and join us in Mt. Bachelor, Oregon.

Remember when you were in school and you spent your winter evenings in front of the television hoping for a snow day? As a child, few things were more thrilling than a snow day. Well now you can recapture that excitement at Mt. Bachelor. It has a unique landscape, a volcanic cone in the Cascade Mountains. One can head out in any direction to the mountain's circumference of 101 or more trails. Mt. Bachelor has the highest elevation in both Oregon and Washington. The mountain has 10 lifts, seven are Express quads and an average snowfall of over 400 inches. If you want to mellow a bit, check out the Nordic trails for a slower paced version of skiing, or try snowshoeing which is just hiking with tennis racquets strapped to your feet (kind of). Want a break from skiing, go to one of the Sno-Parks, build a snowman, make a snow angel, snowball challenge or grab a toboggan. Let's play!

Our lodging is at The Double Tree, in downtown Bend, located within walking distance to shopping, restaurants and brewpubs. The Double Tree offers a complementary buffet each morning. Fuel up with eggs, potatoes, sausage, bacon or waffles to get started for the day. If soaking your bones is a good way to beat the chill of the snow, the hotel offers 24-hour access to indoor pool. Another option, McMenamins Old St. Francis School, a 1936 Catholic schoolhouse, has a soaking pool surrounded by luminous stained glass and open-air ceiling to check out the evening sky.

If snuggling by a fireplace is your idea of fun, there are dozens of fire pits all over town. Including a collection of them around the Old Mill District. You want to cozy up to a fire and enjoy a pint and a sandwich, then Crux Fermentation Project is the place to go.

If you'd rather warm up from the inside out, try some spice rum from Oregon Spirit Distillers or try Bendistillery's Hazelnut Espresso Vodka with some cocoa and whipped cream.

If your idea of fun is a pint or two with friends, Bend has 14 craft breweries. Discover the Bend Ale Trail, get an Atlas and passport and try each one. There is the Brew bus with Wanderlust Tours, it will pick you up at the hotel, visit three of the breweries with a progressive meal at each stop. Old St. Francis School also has a pub, brewery and on Wednesday evening McMenamins hosts a band that starts at 7:00 PM. Now we are talking adult fun!

On Friday evening many businesses stay open late

erving food and wine transforming their venues into mini art galleries. What a nice way to end our week with a stroll through town.

If you have gone to an EPSC Winter Carnival, you'll know there is much more included than in a normal ski trip. There is an EPSC happy hour with drink specials, apres ski party, ski racing; mountain lunch and a farewell reception. This year the theme is Volcanic Confluence Party including Hokulea Dancers and Spinsterz Fire Dancers.

The book for the month of July will be: *Memorirs of a Geisha* by Arthur Golden

A literary sensation and runaway bestseller, this brilliant debut novel tells with seamless authenticity and exquisite lyricism the true confessions of one of Japan's most celebrated geisha.

Speaking to us with the wisdom of age and in a voice at once haunting and startlingly immediate, Nitta Sayuri tells the story of her life as a geisha. It begins in a poor fishing village in 1929, when, as a nine-year-old girl with unusual blue-gray eyes, she is taken from her home and sold into slavery to a renowned geisha house. We witness her transformation as she learns the rigorous arts of the geisha: dance and music; wearing kimono, elaborate makeup, and hair; pouring sake to reveal just a touch of inner wrist; competing with a jealous rival for men's solicitude and the money that goes with it.



In *Memoirs of a Geisha*, we enter a world where appearances are paramount; where a girl's virginity is auctioned to the highest bidder; where women are trained to beguile the most powerful men; and where love is scorned as illusion. It is a unique and triumphant work of fiction—at once romantic, erotic, suspenseful—and completely unforgettable.
