## Whistler Blackcomb, British Columbia

Fall Line Ski Club returns to one of its favorite destinations, Whistler-Blackcomb in British Columbia, from February 20-27, 2021. We are long overdue to return. If you haven't been there in a while, a lot has changed. Join us for what is sure to be a memorable ski trip.

Those who have been to Whistler, know all about the 8,100 skiable acres including two mountains, three glaciers, over 5,000 vertical feet on both peaks, over 230 trails, 36 lifts, 18 mountain restaurants and the over 400 inches of snow the area receives.

If you have not yet been to Whistler, this is a great opportunity to get to know one of the premier ski areas in North America (and therefore, the world too). This is one really huge ski area, with enough variety to be enjoyable to skiers and snowboarders of all abilities. Find out why this is one of the favorite ski areas of so many skiers.

The two mountains are connected by the Peak 2 Peak Gondola, and is one of the longest and highest gondolas in the world. A quick eleven minute ride will take you from one mountain to the other.

We will be flying through Chicago to Vancouver, BC and traveling by bus for two hours to Whistler-Blackcomb. We will be staying in The Whistler Village at the 4-Star Crystal Lodge and Suites, conveniently located a few hundred yards from the base gondolas. The hotel offers double occupancy rooms, heated pool, hot tub and sauna, wireless internet access, and ski storage and valet service.

Enjoy the many restaurants, bars and shops in the pedestrian-only Whistler Village.

After our last day of skiing on Friday, we will return to Vancouver and stay at the Fairmont Vancouver Airport hotel, for one last night of fun with friends, and which will also allow us to fly home Saturday morning, returning to Philadelphia at a reasonable time.



The trip opens for sign-up on June 16<sup>th</sup>. The price of the trip is \$2,000 per person for early sign-up, and \$2,075 after July 21<sup>st</sup>. The trip includes:

- ◆ 6 night accommodations at the Crystal Lodge and Suites, double occupancy

# KEYSTONE, COLORADO JANUARY 5-10, 2021 "FIRST SKI AREA TO OPEN IN COLORADO FOR 2020 SKI SEASON"

The Keystone Resort ski area (now owned by Vail) occupies 3 separate mountains: Dercum Mountain, North Peak, and The Outback. Recent expansion of terrain and services offers snow-cat skiing in Independence Bowl, Bergman Bowl, Erickson Bowl, in addition to the existing North Bowl and South Bowl on Wapiti Peak. The winter activities include alpine skiing, snowboarding, tubing, ice skating, cross-country skiing, horse-drawn sleigh ride dinners, and snowmobiling.

## The Keystone ski area has::

- ◆ 2,870 acres (11.6 km<sup>2</sup>)
- ◆ 3,128 feet (953 m) vertical
- ◆ Base elevation: 9,280 feet (2,830 m)
- ◆ Summit elevation: 12,408 feet (3,782 m)
- ◆ 131 trails
- ◆ Degree of difficulty percentages for trails: Easiest-14 percent, More Difficult-29 percent, Most Difficult-57 percent
- ◆ 20 Lifts (2 gondolas, 2 express six-pack & 4-high speed quads.

## WHITEFISH, MONTANA

Twenty & Ten years ago Fall Line crafted trips to Fernie & Whitefish. It was titled a "Two Nation Vacation." We tried it again a few years ago but people did not want to pack twice and move once in a week trip. So, Whitefish alone is what this trip will be. And how this resort's reputation has grown over that time. Amazing stories of incredible skiing, picturesque views and lights-out amounts of snow. So for those of you looking for adventure in the *real* West, come join me and 32 others!

First and foremost, how's the skiing? Simply put: fantastic! "The Fish" boasts 3000 acres, spread across three faces of the mountain, featuring 93 trails, vast bowls and tree skiing amongst the "snow ghosts" to the unique and challenging Hellroaring Basin. When the view cooperates, the jagged peaks of Glacier National Park offer stunning vistas. The Fish averages 29 feet of snowfall blanketing this mountain area with fantastic skiing and including fabulous tree skiing too. And what about lift lines? In Montana, lift lines are unheard of.

Our accommodation is at The Lodge at Whitefish Lake, which is just a short shuttle ride to the mountain on the SNOW bus or via The Lodge's many shuttle vans and equally short ride to the Town of Whitefish. Whitefish is a charming and very rustic small town offering numerous saloons, fine restaurants, and shops. The Lodge offers a ski & boot valet. Once you exit the shuttle a valet will take your skis. Then you remove your boots in front of a vast outdoor fireplace in this large vestibule of the front entrance. The valet will take your boots handing you your walking shoes – your boots will be dried and warmed overnight – complimentary as a guest. The Lodge offers a number of conveniences, including an indoor pool, hot tub restaurant and lounge to help ease you into the evening. In the morning The Lodge includes a gourmet breakfast to fuel you for the slopes.

So, if you're an adventurous Fall Liner who yearns for a ski experience out of the ordinary, this is a trip you will NOT want to miss. Whitefish, Montana – ding – knock it off that bucket list!

## LAKE TAHOE, CALIFORNIA/NEVADA

Have you ever skied from one state to another? Can you imagine a ski slope ending in a lake? You achieve both feats at Heavenly Mountain Resort! Take the Dipper Express Four-Pack, hop off and decide. The choices are endless. Do you ski California or Nevada? Will it be 34 miles of wide-open, groomed cruisers, 1,600-foot plunges in the double-black diamond canyons or the most outrageous tree skiing in North America?

With an average of 360 inches of snowfall per year, Heavenly gets some of the best snow around. However, bluebird days are enjoyed 300 days a year on average. Go ahead, imagine soaking up that California sun! High above the sapphire-blue waters of Lake Tahoe, Heavenly is one of the most unique snow resorts on the planet. Whether you and your friends come to ski or ride from sunrise to sunset, explore the craft beer scene, spend some time doing some gambling, sampling the various restaurants or just relaxing and unwinding, Heavenly is all about a better way of being together, which they call "Mountain Together."

Our trip will include a Wednesday private coach visit to Kirkwood Mountain Resort, about 30 minutes below South Lake Tahoe. There is something magical that happens when storms roll into Kirkwood. Some like to say we measure our snow in feet not inches, and others simply sum it up as the "K-Factor." Storms come from the north and south, pick up precipitation on the west coast, funnel through a tight canyon up the Sierra Foothills and UNLOAD on Kirkwood's perfect position. The "K-Factor" generates quality skiing and riding conditions throughout the winter season. Whether it is a sunny California day or pure stormy bliss, Kirkwood provides fun skiing and riding in all conditions.

Our stay at the Lake Tahoe Resort Hotel, includes a one-hour welcome happy hour with light snacks. And during the week discounted drink prices are available for the hotels daily happy hours. Heavenly's gondola is a short walk from the hotel. The gondola is your entrance up into the mountain to start your day. After the first day, you can leave your skis at the rental shops, at ski lockers or use the hotel's ski valet. Along the way are many great places to go inside or sit outside for a drink to soak up the last of the day's sun & fun, or head to the hotel for its indoor pool & hot tub, sauna, fitness room, etc. You will find the Lake Tahoe Resort Hotel to be a fun, social gathering spot.

# VAL GARDENA, ITALY W/POST-TRIP EXTENSION TO MALTA (4 NIGHTS) TAKE TWO MARCH 5-17, 2021

While disappointed at first for having to reschedule our club's trip to 2021, I became elated that our group had dodged a bullet by the name of "CoronaVirus" when the ski area closed on what would have been our second day of skiing and then the town closed. Then, Germany closed their borders so I'm not sure how we would have made it to Munich for our flight home, and the fact that we would never have made it to Malta would have broken our hearts. Other ski clubs were not as fortunate, and my heart goes out to those who passed and who were sickened by this Virus. I miss my travel and ski buddies so much and can not wait to finally go on the most anticipated trip yet!

**Val Gardena:** There are 175 km of slopes available. 79 lifts transport the guests. The winter sports area is situated between the elevations of 1,236 and 2,518 m. Whether skiing on the famous Saslong World Cup slope or enjoying a break at one of the rustic mountain huts, the ski resort of Val Gardena is always top class. There are slopes of all difficulty levels for skiers and snowboarders. The latest highlight is the "Piz Seteur" 10-person cable car in a Pininfarina design and complete with sophisticated technical features for greater comfort, safety and performance. Val Gardena is connected to the lifts and slopes in the neighboring valleys by the Sellaronda tour. Athletic skiers can therefore look forward to a huge winter sports arena. It is part of the "Dolomiti Superski", the biggest "ski carousel" of the Alps with more than 450 uphill transportation devices and more than 1220 km of slopes. 90% of our ski slopes, representing 1.100 km, are complete with a programmed snowmaking facility which guarantees wonderful skiing conditions.

**4\* Hotel Antares / Selva:** Located in the heart of the Selva di Val Gardena, and at the center of a fairy-tale-like scenery close to shopping, a supermarket, bar, café, ski resorts, churches and bakeries. It is 200 meters from Ciampinoi—the entryway to 500 kms of uninterrupted Dolomite ski slopes. The hotel offers free WiFi, assigned ski lockers / boot warmers, free access to swimming pool, spa, Wellness Center and the Technogym.
