The Beaver Creek moguls started out nicely groomed but after 2 hours they were down to hard and scraped up. The Roughlock run is called the James Bond run by the locals. It is a blue run that takes you thru bridges and tunnels and between the houses of the very wealthy. Barbara Fulton enjoyed the run so much that

she skied it several times.

Paul said that Grouse Mountain with its black and double black trails had phenomenal skiing. The elevation is 10,688 feet at the top. The day it snowed the fog at the top of Centennial Lift limited visibility to 5 feet.

Tuesday many Fall Liners took the gondola to the Westin and a bus to Vail. The weather was great. Vail's Blue Sky Basin had stellar skiing, but the visibility was limited because of flat light. Cloud 9 was a wonderfully groomed trail that provided perfectly spaced trees for a euphoric skiing experience. Poppy Fields and China Bowl are perfect for both intermediate and advanced skiers. In all Vail has 7 back bowls extending 6 miles.

Paul said Vail's best bump run was Whistle Pig. He found the beer at Pepis bar amazing with all German brews. Paul met a gentleman from England and they did some Mach 1 "i.e.; damn fast skiing". I heard many different nationalities speaking as I walked thru Vail Village.

Ernt Allbright, a former POW, comes home from the Vietnam war a changed and volatile man. When he loses yet another job, he makes an impulsive decision: He will move his family north, to Alaska, where they will live off the grid in America's last true frontier.

Thirteen-year-old Leni, a girl coming of age in a tumultuous time, caught in the riptide of her parents' passionate, stormy relationship, dares to hope that a new land will lead to a better future for her family. 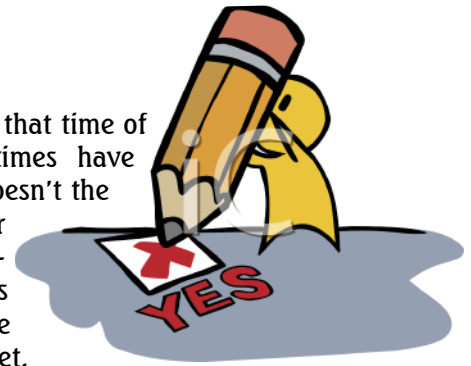
