### Frankford Hall

Fishtown, 1210 Frankford Avenue. Located in the heart of Fishtown, Frankford Hall is probably the most authentic-feeling beer garden in town, with indoor and outdoor seating for more than 400, multiple bars, an abundance of picnic tables, and games ranging from Jenga to ping pong. Effectively, the space is usable year-round with the help of more than a dozen heat lamps, a couple fire pits and an overhead heating system. Classic German foods (think pretzels, bratwurst) plus burgers are available at a walk-up counter, as is a hefty beer menu that includes everything from traditional German beers to craft specialties. Frankford Hall offers both indoor and outdoor seating, and keeps guest mighty cozy with multiple heat lamps and fire pits.



# POCONO BIG DAY OUT

To go or not to go? That was the question given the ever changing weather predictions (mostly bad) for the Jim Thorpe PA area leading up to our Saturday afternoon departure. But go we did, and it turned out to be perfect. Sunday morning was cool, clearing and that continued throughout the day. Cool temps were a blessing, as I initially had doubts about the 25 mile bike ride in upper 90's with high humidity. The entire day was beautiful and more like a September day than an August day. What a break!

It's quite an operation with a lot of people there both Fall Liners and others.



**Bike:** 25 miles (the guides ended it at 22.5 miles due to a group who were struggling a bit) on an easy grade, mostly shady. It follows the Lehigh river through the Lehigh Gorge State Park,. There were numerous waterfalls (even one big one where you can take a dip), many ruins of an old canal and other structures. The trail follows rail lines, some active and some historic. It accesses areas of scenic beauty and interest that were not accessible by road. Guides both lead and trailing carried backpacks of bottled water so there was no risk of not staying hydrated. Guides also carry portable air pumps, which came in handy for one of our group.



**Hike:** The hike was actually short but the initial few hundred yards were very steep and slippery from previous day's rains,. It had a great overlook and was then an easy hike down to the 900 ft. Turn Hole Tunnel, which takes you to an overlook of the Lehigh

river. The tunnel was built in 1886 by the Central Railroad of New Jersey and it carried part of that railroad's main line until 1912. It was abandoned in the 1950's. It is all natural rock with no lining.



- **Rafting:** Our group consisted of 4 rafts with both a lead and trailing guide following in kayaks. A few of us had rafting experience but it is not a requirement since it is a "learn on the job" thing. Lots of easy rapids with some pretty gnarly ones that got the adrenaline up. Plenty of calm water where you could abandon ship and take a dip. Two guests in our raft were Mohamed and Jen from North Jersey. There was lots of bonding during the 7 miles downriver. Mohamed was even interested in the ski club as he takes one trip a year to Colorado and skis locally, so we did some recruiting. Maybe we can get reimbursed by the board and say our expenses were business expenses??

The Big Day Out ended at Pocono Whitewater's outfit center with dinner served, adult beverages available, campfire & marshmallows. It was a perfect ending for a perfect day. We were totally spent but the good kind of spent like after a great, hard day skiing.

Summary: Excellent weather, very well organized, plenty of staff, lots of food & water. My one recommendation for future BDO participants, go the day before and stay overnight in one of the local hotels. We actually stayed on Sunday night and didn't regret it. The 15 miles from Pocono Whitewater to the hotel was about all the drive I had left in me before I had a good night's sleep. I am very glad that I answered my question by going.

When four classmates from a small Massachusetts college move to New York to make their way, they're broke, adrift, and buoyed only by their friendship and ambition. There is kind, handsome Willem, an aspiring actor; JB, a quick-witted, sometimes cruel Brooklyn-born painter seeking entry to the art world; Malcolm, a frustrated architect at a prominent firm; and withdrawn, brilliant, enigmatic Jude, who serves as their center of gravity.

Over the decades, their relationships deepen and darken, tinged by addiction, success, and pride. Yet their greatest challenge, each comes to realize, is Jude himself, by midlife a terrifyingly talented litigator yet an increasingly broken man, his mind and body scarred by an unspeakable childhood, and haunted by what he fears is a degree of trauma that he'll not only be unable to overcome—but that will define his life forever.

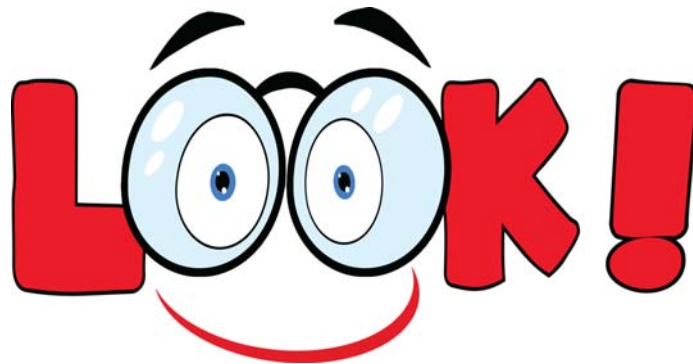
