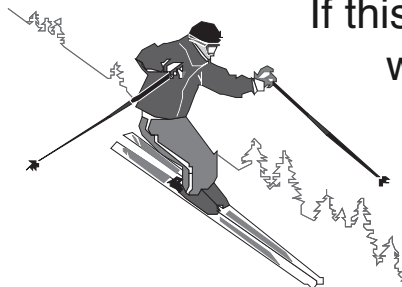

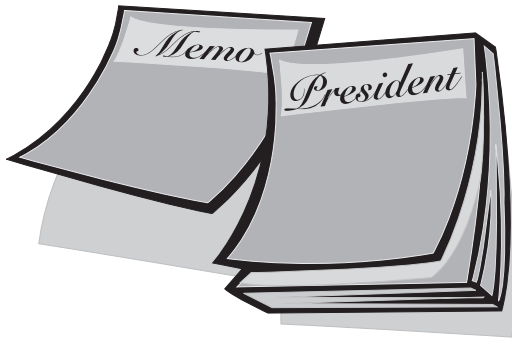

# CO-ED WIFFLEBALL

## LAST CHANCE TO SIGN-UP

Starting in January/February

So, what the heck is Wiffleball anyhow? Well, Wiffleball is a variation of the sport of baseball designed for indoor or outdoor play in confined areas. It is played using a perforated, light-weight, plastic ball and a long, plastic bat, generally on a triangular playing field.

The Wiffle ball was invented by David N. Mullany of Fairfield, Connecticut in 1953 when he designed a ball that curved easily for his 12-year old son. It was named when his son and his friends would refer to a strikeout as a "wiff". A classic Wiffle ball is about the same size as a regulation baseball and is hollow plastic no more than 1/8th of an inch thick. One hemisphere is perforated with eight 3/4" inch oblong holes, with a solid second hemisphere. This construction allows pitchers to throw a tremendous variety and size of curveballs, sinkers, risers and tailers. Wiffle balls are typically packaged with a hollow, hard plastic bat that measures 31 inches (790 mm) in length and about 1.25 inches in diameter.

## Stratton, VT

With Philadelphia (and Sea Scape Landscaping, LLC) anticipating a major storm the weekend of January 9-11, 44 Fall Liners (including intrepid bus driver Jerry Walgate) shoved off at 6:05 Friday night for the first weekend trip of the season with a last-minute change in trip leader.

It was, instead, Stratton Mountain that was the beneficiary of a winter storm event, as Saturday's groomed cruisers turned into Sunday's powder runs.

A steady fall of soft, small flakes began at dinnertime Saturday and continued through Sunday morning, drifting down at a pleasant rate of one-half inch per hour. With all trails open, abundant greens throughout the lower mountain and on one side at the top, and the double black diamonds all ungroomed except for Upper Spruce, there was plenty of terrain for all tastes in alpine skiing.

Although there were no injuries, the trip was not without some adventure. Dennis Halterman ventured off for some tree and freestyle skiing until John Steele insisted he return to their group, which also included Lou Cullen and Rich Trantham. Ann Marsteller, having done her duty on Saturday

by guiding Dennis in the morning and us in the afternoon, was off on her own for three hours of powder skiing at her swift pace.

It was nice to see all of the newcomers on the trip. We have to apologize we cannot remember all of your names to mention here, but we are looking forward to seeing each of you on another Fall Line trip in the near future. And our thanks to all the old-timers (not that they are old chronologically) who helped out with the beverages and ice, etc., and made the newcomers feel welcome. It was also nice to see Kathy Walgate on a Fall Line trip again.

Most Fall Liners stopped in time to catch the 1 p.m. kickoff of the Eagles 23-11 victory over the New York Football Giants at either Grizzly's, Mulligan's, or back at the Inn at Stratton, to which we had been upgraded at no additional charge. A few die-hard skiers stayed out as the powder got heavier and the bumps built up, catching bits of the game on the TV in the changing room until they could make it to the spacious dining/bar area of the inn to join the die-hard Eagles fans who had been there all along or moved down from Grizzly's and Mulligan's at halftime. An excellent time was had by the Eagles fans, who managed to drown out the Giants fans staying at the inn.

# SNOWBIRD

Opening the 2008 – 2009 FLSC Season with  
Firsts....

From December 10 – 15, 2008, a select group of Fall Liners took the initiative of kicking-off the 2008-2009 ski season by making first tracks at the back-to-back Snowbird and Alta ski resorts located in Utah's Wasatch mountain range. But there were other firsts about this trip. It was the Club's first flight under the *new* luggage fees recently enacted by the major air carriers on domestic flights. As trip leader, this was also the first time that I had the opportunity to help kick-off the new season in the same year that I closed the season with Vail 2008.

## ***A bit of a Reverse Experience...***

Our departure day was a bit of a reverse experience in that a bottleneck occurred at the ticket counter and not with the TSA screening process. During this go-around, Delta had issues in manipulating their systems for the correct luggage charges and this delayed the check-in process. Once rigged, the hit on the way out for the luggage (including boots & skies) was \$40, but on the return (maybe they were having a special on that day..) was *only* \$30.. But, the delay that I anticipated with the TSA folks never occurred. The security screening process at Philly's Terminal 'A' was just as smooth, efficient and fast as in Salt Lake. But, this is Philadelphia and one has to ask: "Could they really have improved the process that much?" It was just a few years back that some us stood in a screening line that snaked its way out into the parking garage.

## ***A Weather Delay...***

On this particular Wednesday, rain was not a good mix for flying. The departure gate agent brought our attention to the fact that we were missing one *small*, yet important detail – the aircraft. The issue was resolved in about 60 minutes and we boarded. For this group of 22, our ski vacation was now getting off the ground. Complete with free beverages, snacks, and a movie, it was an easy 4-½ hour flight into Salt Lake.

By 8 P.M. we were at the Salt Lake City Airport. After collecting our goodies, loading the bus, and brief "beverage" stop, it was around 10 P.M. when we arrived at The Lodge at Snowbird. With the transfer time short and convenient, it is easy to understand why Snowbird is a favorite destination.

## ***Day 1 – Warming-up in Our Backyard***

Thursday was picture perfect. We experienced a sun-filled blue sky with beautiful vistas. Many in the group

opted for the free continental breakfast and orientation. In a sign of the economy, we learned that the Snowbird–Alta connector trail, along with some other lifts would not open for a few more weeks. Additionally, the feeder bus to Alta was operating with very limited service. In the larger picture, those small pimples had little impact on our total experience for the next three days.

## ***Starting with a Tour...***

Many chose to get their ski legs back by enjoying the half-day private mountain tour hosted by Snowbird's Marketing and Sales Director, Scott Appleman. For nearly three hours, Scott showed the group the "ins and outs" of skiing Snowbird (aka: the *Bird*). When skiing at the *Bird* you plan your day by following the sun.

## ***Rounding Out the Day with Wine & Cheese...***

Our introductory day was capped with an early evening casual wine and cheese in the lodge lobby. Surrounded with the huge fireplace, and pleasant holiday music, we enjoyed the opportunity to discuss the highs and lows of our first day on skis.

## ***Day 2 – A Day for Altagolics***

Friday was another day and another experience. Many Fall Liners piled into the Lodge's Suburban for the 10-minute ride to Alta. A potential problem with Alta is that those who go there prefer not to go ski elsewhere and become "*Altagolics*." Other than satisfying this increased dependency with skiing at Alta, there are no cures for the addiction.

## ***Paradise to Many...***

Traditional, and maybe a bit rustic, Alta is a downhill skier's paradise. It is a place where the powder is pure and fresh tracks are in pairs. And, it is a place where you know that aside from an avalanche or snowmobile, you can only get mowed over by another downhiller. It is a place where those *hey dude like* snowboarders are not welcomed.

## ***A Different Experience...***

Although it is a backdoor neighbor to Snowbird, Alta is a different experience. Maybe it is the location or elevation, but Alta is a place for *Powder Hogs*. Not fancy or posh, but it is a stable that has not changed in years. Alta is a bit of antiquity with high-speed lifts (less the safety bar). In the larger picture, both Alta and Snowbird are mountains that truly complement each other. On this day, we had mild temperatures and sky conditions that changed by the hour in anticipation of a big dump. The day's backdrop was a canvas of clouds producing flat light, followed with blues and a bright December sun. By late afternoon, that canvas became cloudy. Although the skiing was good, it was about to get *much* better.

### Party Time...

On Friday evening, the group enjoyed a traditional Fall Line party complete with pizzas, salads and drinks. It proved to be the perfect setting for meeting new friends, conversations and jokes. There was an abundant amount of food and snacks, and for many, this was also a dinner event. A special thanks goes out to the club members who helped in setting-up and cleaning-up.

### Day 3 – A Fresh 10” Makes it a Powder Day

Saturday was really *another* type of ski day; and it also felt more like January. The overnight mini-storm delivered a good 10” (plus) of fresh powder and this was going to be a *powder day*. The price for all of this good stuff was the temperature. Skiers and the thermometer shivered at the 19° base temperature. By afternoon it was even colder. On this day, the Fall Line population over at the *Bird* was a bit light as most opted for Alta.

### Extraordinary...

Although the clouds and high winds delayed Alta's opening, when it finally opened, the skiing was extraordinary. Aside from a slight visibility issue, we enjoyed that special feeling of gliding through the knee-deep powder. Working from the Collins lift, powder hogs had an easy job of finding the unmarked runs and making fresh tracks. The limited visibility also made it the perfect day for skiing with the trees. On this faithful day, the weather never improved, but the powder continued getting better and better. At the end of the ski day, a core of Fall Liners wrapped up their day by relaxing in the outdoor hot tub.

### Day 4 – Truly Bitter-Sweet

Sunday, the last day of our early season warm-up, was truly *bittersweet*. We were greeted with a morning base temperature of close to zero degrees and cold pellets of snow hitting any exposed body part. Eventually it warmed up to a comfy 20°. Sweet was the several inches of fresh powder that fell overnight. Again, it was just another day for fresh tracks. During this early season warm-up, our *take* was over 13” of fresh powder. *Not too bad* for the second week in December.



Over at Snowbird, the snowfall was significant enough to result in an inbounds “uncontrolled” avalanche. It was a cold reminder that this is a sport with inherent dangers.

### Heading Home - At Some Point It *Just* has to End

Monday, December 15, was cold, and still dark at 6:15 A.M. when the bus arrived to take us to the airport. But on a return travel day, the blend of dark with cold is an appropriate mix. Additionally, the dark provided a type of natural acoustic that seemed to soften sounds. Combined with the cold, it was the perfect mix for all to reflect on four unique days of early season skiing. Before long, we were at the airport waiting for our flight home.

### Completing the Task...

In the Wasatch Region, it takes a bit longer for the sun to rise and peek through those magnificent snowcapped mountains. At around 8:30 A.M. in the terminal, a brilliant sun was just starting to peek through and separate that invisible ridge of clouds and mountains. It offered us a bit more of reflection time, and a look back at what we conquered.

Now, our trip of “firsts” was about to be completed. For all on the trip, it was a privilege to be responsible for opening Fall Line's 2008 – 2009 ski season *with* snow. And, by 4:00 P.M., we were back in Philadelphia, heading home and just in time for dinner.

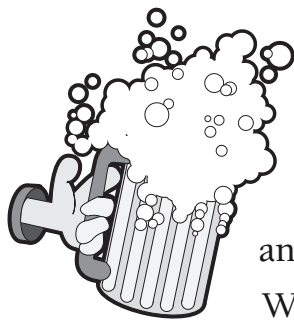

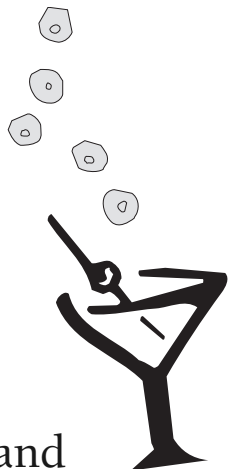
