

New Jersey Wine Tasting Tour

February 19, 2011



Have you ever wanted to go on a wine tour but didn't have the money to go to California? Well, you don't have to travel that far! On February 19th Fall Line will lead you to a few of the best wineries in the state of New Jersey. No, this is not a misprint. Yes, New Jersey has wineries. Actually there are over 30 in the state but 30 is way too many to get to in a day so let's just start with five that are close to home.

We will meet at 11:00 am on Saturday, Feb 19th in the Burger King parking lot on Route 38 & Ark Road (across from Prospector's). We can carpool or you can drive on your own – your choice.

Winery #1 - We will head to Atco for our first stop at Amalthea Cellars. At Amalthea you have the opportunity for a complementary sample of twelve different wines. There are also six "Legend Editions" that are incredible. While they never offer all six Legend's for tasting you can bet on at least one being available. Amalthea wines are truly award winning. The winery has won gold medals in competition with French and California wines. This place is a must stop!

Winery #2 – Next we will head down the road a bit to Hammonton and stop in at Plagido's. While Plagido does charge \$5.00 for a tasting, they will refund that charge if you purchase a bottle and with their award winning selection that should not be hard to accomplish. Plagido's has twenty two wines to sample.

Winery #3 – We then will travel about nine minutes away to DiMatteo's. Di-Matteo offers thirteen varieties with some of the best fruit wines in the area, winning many awards.

Winery #4 – About eight minutes away is Sharrott Winey. Sharrott also charges \$5.00 for a tasting but you get a souvenir glass to keep. Even though Sharrott is fairly new, just opening to the public in 2008, they have eleven different wines to choose from. And just because they are new does not mean that they are not proven. They have won medals every year with a "best of class" award in 2010.

Winery #5 – From Sharrott we will drive about 25 minutes to Shamong for our last stop at Valenzano Winery. Valenzano offers a wide variety of wines with nineteen to choose from.

The day does not have to end at Valenzano. We will find a local BYOB restaurant where we can end the day enjoying dinner and talk about and taste some of the yummy wines we just purchased. OR if we feel that there is a better selection of BYOB restaurants near the Atco winery we can always reverse the above and start from Valenzano and end at Amalthea. Whatever works for the group!

VAIL - December 15-20, 2010

If our first trip of the season, Vail, is any indication of what 2011 has to offer, we are looking at a great ski season.

Usually someone earns the first fall of the year, but you expect it on the slopes; however, not for John Kennedy. He did not even make it into the Philadelphia Terminal. He was laying in the street, on his back with a backpack, his skis in his hand and his suitcase on his chest... He looked like a beached turtle.

The plane was on time and we arrived in Denver on schedule. All luggage and skis arrived with us and the bus left soon after arrival. The only hitch was "it was snowing" so our trip to Vail took about 3-1/2 hours, but what we had to look forward to was worth it.

Have you ever thought what would constitute a perfect ski day?... temperature, sunshine, wind, clouds, lift lines and new snowfall. Even though we had a small group of 12, it was a GREAT group. Unfortunately, the first fall of the new ski season (on the slopes) was Margarita Baranova who twisted her knee on our first day. We all hope that she has a speedy recovery. Cindy, Paul and Deborah spent their first day at Vail accumulating 30,000 feet plus of vertical. Sometimes in the years of FLSC you meet some skiers that make you think of Frick and Frack or Abbott and Costello. But when it comes to Bob Nuss and Lowe Parrish, it's hard to tell who is the straight man and who is the comedian. Maybe it would be easier if we referred to them as George Burns and Gracie Allen. When they are around, they sure put some fun into the trip.

Some of the comments of our group were "loved the trip, had a fantastic time", "the Evergreen is in the perfect location and the room was nice", Diane M. "Vail is beautiful, the snow perfect", "had a great time, conditions were great, lots of good runs, can't wait until next trip". John S.
