The cost is only \$10.00 per person, which gets you all you can eat pancakes, scrambled eggs, sausage, coffee, tea, OJ and Bloody Marys.

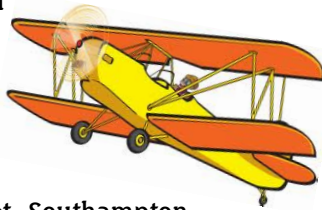
