FLSC Mr. Chris Nast Kayak Wrap-Up

Saturday, July 9, 2016 started off very gray. Although it was not too hot in the morning, there was a light mist in the air as I left my house at 8 AM, heading East into Hammonton to get a coffee at Wawa and then head down to the Black Horse Pike to Palace Outfitters to sign folks up and lead our annual 4-hour kayak paddle down the Great Egg Harbor River. The weather definitely did not look very promising! As it turns out, though, there can be a "silver lining" to not perfect weather: The usual summer weekend large crowds at Palace Outfitters were way down, and even after an hour of waiting for all to arrive and signing everyone up, there was almost no line for me to put my order of boats in and pay for them!

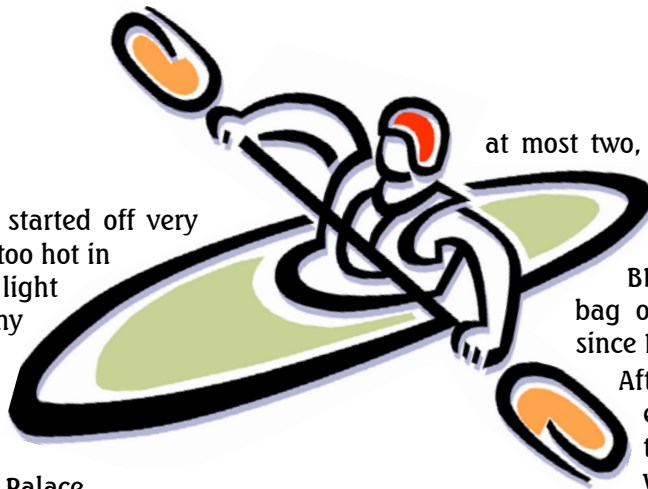
I put the order in at approximately 9:45, with a nice round number of 20 single kayaks and 2 transports, and within 10 minutes tops, the trailers were loaded and we headed off to the put-in spot, approximately 8 miles upstream.

We had no problems with missing equipment at the put-in, and I shoved the first kayak in at 10:10 AM. I was last in 8 minutes later – off to a good start!

The river was running a bit low, as there hadn't been much rain in the area lately.

A few people commented to me that those who didn't show up because the weather wasn't perfect in the morning were missing it – it was actually beautiful, not sunny or too hot out. Everyone was having a very good time...

Other than maybe a single slightly difficult area, or



at most two, things went very smooth. I did not hear of any "swampings" up to the lunch area, where we all stopped. Joe Durkin offered up some GREAT BBQ ribs! Someone else had a large bag of cherries that I grabbed a few of, since I don't bring a lunch...

After 20-30 minutes at lunch, we headed back out to do the second half of the paddle.

We noticed that the sky was getting darker and darker, but saw no menacing clouds nor heard any thunder, but it WAS getting darker! I mentioned to whoever I was paddling next to at the time "I hope I don't feel any sudden cold gust of wind", mentioning that the previous summer, at a large outdoor blues concert I was at out in Chicago, the weather was very similar, and standing there at that concert, I suddenly did feel that cold gust of wind, and, even faster than I thought it would take – like within 30 seconds, it started pouring!

Well, on our trip out on the river, I never did feel a cold gust of wind,, but, at 12:53 PM (I was wearing a cheap waterproof Casio watch, okay?), the skies OPENED UP on us! It rained like there was no tomorrow! The raindrops must have been at least an inch around! I was waiting for hailstones to start falling! It just poured on all of us, for a good 10-15 minutes... Not fun. The only good things (if you can actually say that about the situation) were that first, there was no lightning (actually, very good for us!), and second, the air temperature never dropped, so although we were soaked, we didn't really get cold.

It continued to rain on us for a total of approximately ½ hour, but the pace slowed down greatly, and finally stopped after passing over us, thank goodness!

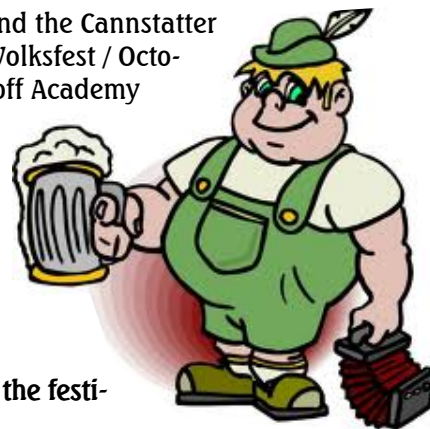

Fishtown, 1210 Frankford Avenue. Located in the heart of Fishtown, Frankford Hall is probably the most authentic-feeling beer garden in town, with indoor and outdoor seating for more than 400, multiple bars, an abundance of picnic tables, and games ranging from Jenga to ping pong. Effectively, the space is usable year-round with the help of more than a dozen heat lamps, a couple fire pits and an overhead heating system. Classic German foods (think pretzels, bratwurst) plus burgers are available at a walk-up counter, as is a hefty beer menu that includes everything from traditional German beers to craft specialties.

The High Line (also known as the High Line Park) is a 1.45 mile-long New York City linear park built in Manhattan on an elevated section of a disused New York Central Railroad spur called the West Side Line. This walkway runs from Gansevoort Street to West 34th Street.

- 14th Street Passage
- Diller-von Furstenberg Sundeck & Water Feature
- Chelsea Market Passage
- Northern Spur Preserve
- 10th Avenue Square & Overlook
- Chelsea Thicket
- 23rd Street Lawn
- 26th Street Viewing Spur, etc.

So, put on your best walking shoes and join me to tour this little gem in NYC.

Here is my plan for now. I will be at the Hamilton Train Station by 9:00am on Saturday, August 27th, to purchase my ticket to catch the next train to NYC. From Penn Station we will head out on 34th street to climb up onto the High Line and begin our journey.

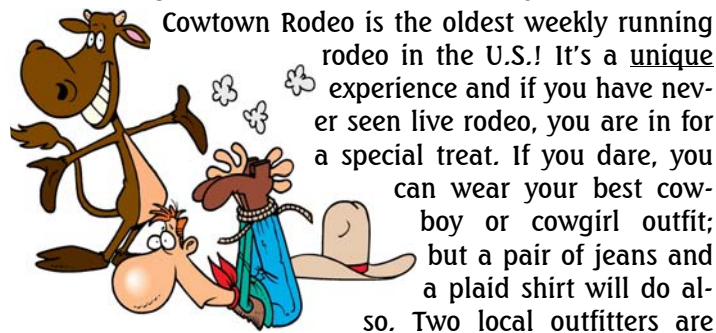

Enjoy Professional Rodeo in the true tradition of the Old West right here in Southern New Jersey.



Cowtown Rodeo is the oldest weekly running rodeo in the U.S.! It's a unique experience and if you have never seen live rodeo, you are in for a special treat. If you dare, you can wear your best cowboy or cowgirl outfit; but a pair of jeans and a plaid shirt will do also. Two local outfitters are located close-by where they sell everything from head to toe.

Part of the Evening's Events and Demonstrations are:

Bull Riding; Bareback Bronc Riding; Saddle Bronc Riding; Steer Wrestling; Tie Down Roping; Team Roping; Girls Barrel Racing

Tailgating (fun, fun, fun...):

The last few years we always had the greatest time outside in the parking lot (almost didn't want to leave). For the tailgating bring a chair, food to share and your favorite beverages. Later, a small cooler of alcoholic beverages is permitted inside the rodeo.

Parking is free but carpooling is encouraged. If you wish to carpool, some people may meet at **4:00 PM** from the Woodcrest Shopping Center (Route 561 – Haddonfield Berlin Road; Cherry Hill, but I will NOT be there. You will need to communicate with each other about carpooling.) If you want to meet us in the parking lot at the Rodeo, look for our tailgate party. Usually on the left side as you pass the entrance. Look for Joe's large tan TUNDRA pick-up truck and some tables).

Tickets are \$20 **CASH** pp (adults); Groups of **25** or **more** are \$12.50 adults (let's get the discount). In order to get the discount tickets, I'll collect all the cash prior to 6:30 PM during our tailgate and purchase the tickets. Anyone coming after I've purchased the group tickets can join our group, but need to purchase their own ticket at regular ticket office prices.

By latest 7:00 PM sharp we go in as a group to get our seats and the Rodeo starts at 7:30 PM. It would be fun if you'd wear your finest Cowboy / Cowgirl outfit.
