



# FALL LINE SKI CLUB POWDER EXPRESS

## Day Trip to Elk Mountain

Date: Jan. 12, 2018 (ELK is open.)

Cost: \$80, members; \$85 non-members



Since this is a day trip and a great chance to learn to ski or just try out new skis we are relaxing our age requirement for just this one trip. We will not be supplying beer and wine on the bus as with our other ski bus trips.

You must be at least 16 years old. If under 21, you must be accompanied by an adult who will be held responsible. Sign up at Nov. 21 or Dec. 19 mixer meeting at Pennsauken Country Club. If mailing a check, contact the trip leader for instructions. Do not send to club P.O. Box.

The North Chair at Elk Mountain accesses a top elevation of 2,667 ft (813 m) - the highest lift-served skiing in eastern Pennsylvania. Elk has a 925 ft (282 m) vertical drop, 27 trails (six greens, 10 blues and 11 diamonds) and two terrain parks. Five double chair lifts and a fixed-grip quad chair lift provide access to the top of the mountain.

Four of the lifts, including the quad, run from the base to just below the summit of the mountain. Most ski runs are groomed, but a few are allowed to bump up, or become moguled, to allow for additional challenge. The mountain receives, on average, 5 feet of natural snow per season. Snowmaking covers 100% of the 180 acres of skiable terrain. The base complex features a day lodge, guest services, ski school center, restaurant, rentals, and a ski-and-snowboard shop.

Price includes round trip transport on motor coach (leaves from and returns to Danszeisen & Quigley parking lot, Route 70 in Cherry Hill), bagels, juice, coffee on morning bus, full day lift ticket.





# Sunday River, Maine



The trip price of \$629 includes round-trip transportation by motor coach between Mt. Laurel, NJ and the ski resort, 3 nights' double occupancy accommodations at the Jordan Hotel, and a 3-day Sunday River lift ticket. But wait, there's more! The bus will be amply supplied with premium beer, wine, and soda for your enjoyment during the ride up north and back. And, the hotel is hosting a Wine and Cheese Party just for our Ski Club!

Speaking of the hotel, we'll be staying for 3 nights at the ski in/ski out Jordan Hotel, the premier address at



Sunday River. A true skier's destination, the Jordan Hotel lies in an alpine setting next to the ski trails of Jordan Bowl and is the highest and snowiest location at the resort. The hotel is located slope-side, with direct ski-in



and ski-out access to green terrain.

Amenities at the hotel include an outdoor heated pool with two hot tubs, a fitness room and health club with steam room and sauna, and the Jordan Spa. Wi-Fi and resort shuttle service are complimentary.

So what about the skiing, you may ask. Sunday River consists of eight interconnected peaks, with 870 acres of skiable terrain. The resort receives an average annual snowfall of 167 inches. There are 135 trails and glades covering a distance of 52.6 miles, with a total vertical of 2,340 ft. The trails are rated as 30% green, 36% blue, 18% black, and 16% double black. For boarders, there are 35 acres dedicated to freestyle terrain, with six parks and one 18-foot Superpipe.



To get around all those trails, parks and glades, there are 15 lifts including four high-speed quads and a high-speed Chondola (who knew!). So a Chondola, I discovered, is a hybrid type of ski lift that combines the elements of a chairlift and a gondola, allowing cabins and chairs to be used on the same lift line. The cabins and chairs can be changed according to rider load, season and weather conditions. Sunday River's Chondola has 60 chairs and 15 cabins, with four six-passenger chairs in between each eight-passenger cabin. The chance to try out the Chondola alone is worth the cost of the trip, not to mention all that fabulous skiing or riding and the awesome company of Fall Liners! ## SANTA'S HELPERS NEEDED

The holidays are quickly coming upon us. With the hustle and bustle of last minute shopping it is sometimes nice to take the time out and do something for those less fortunate than you. On Saturday, December 23rd at 9:30 am volunteers are needed to assist Sacred Heart Church and Heart of Camden Housing Corporation in distributing over 1,000 food baskets for those in need. After a prayer of thanksgiving and a religious song or two, the volunteers are given a map, they load up their cars and set off on what can only be described as a bizarre scavenger hunt to deliver all the makings of a holiday feast in some of the most poorly marked blocks and houses in Camden. Sacred Heart Church is located at 1739 Ferry Avenue, Camden, NJ 08104 (where Ferry Ave intersects Broadway Ave). Last year they released people (around 10am) in pew order and the first 50 cars got special cards that put their cars in the front of the line so ask about it when you get there. Park as close as you can since a peach basket full of food can get surprisingly heavy. We recommend that each car or truck should have 2 or 3 people in it since someone should stay with the car while others navigate and deliver the baskets. Coming by yourself is not a problem, just come a little early and see me so I can find you someone to pair you up with. I can usually be found near the door distributing the maps with a funny hat on. No need to RSVP, just show up. If you get lost, call my cell phone 856-816-2865, but leave a return number. Reception is spotty at best in 100-year-old stone church basements. It usually takes until about 12:30 pm to 2 to deliver the baskets. You can leave when you want although some Fall Liners go to a local watering hole afterwards for lunch. Just be forewarned.... You might have fun and feel good about yourself afterwards. If you have any questions please just call me. If you can't make it but still want to help out send a check to the Heart of Camden, 1840 S. Broadway, Camden, NJ 08104. Donation money is tight and they really could use your help this year in any amount that you could afford. Thank you in advance for thinking of those in need, even if you can't give of your time or money.

The thrilling new novel from number-one *New York Times* best-selling author Lisa See explores the lives of a Chinese mother and her daughter who has been abandoned and adopted by an American couple.

Li-yan and her family align their lives around the seasons and the farming of tea. There is ritual and routine, and it has been ever thus for generations. Then one day a jeep appears at the village gate - the first automobile any of them have seen - and a stranger arrives.

In this remote Yunnan village, the stranger finds the rare tea he has been seeking and a reticent Akha people. In her biggest seller, *Snow Flower and the Secret Fan*, See introduced the Yao people to her audience. Here she shares the customs of another Chinese ethnic minority, the Akha, whose world will soon change.

Li-yan, one of the few educated girls on her mountain,



translates for the stranger and is among the first to reject the rules that have shaped her existence. When she has a baby outside of wedlock rather than stand by tradition, she wraps her daughter in a blanket, with a tea cake hidden in her swaddling, and abandons her in the nearest city.

After mother and daughter have gone their separate ways, Li-yan slowly emerges from the security and insularity of her village to encounter modern life while Haley grows up a privileged and well-loved California girl. Despite Haley's happy home life, she wonders about her origins, and Li-yan longs for her lost daughter. They both search for and find answers in the tea that has shaped their family's destiny for generations.

A powerful story about a family separated by circumstances, culture, and distance, *The Tea Girl of Hummingbird Lane* paints an unforgettable portrait of a little known region and its people and celebrates the bond

that connects mothers and daughters.
