## CHAMONIX, FRANCE - W/EXTENSION TO CINQUE TERRE, ITALY - FEBRUARY 24 – MARCH 7, 2017

**OOH ... LA ... LA!! CHAMONIX** in France is set at the foot of Mont Blanc, Europe's highest mountain (15,531 feet), tucked in a steep-walled valley near the exact junction of France, Italy and Switzerland, in a setting that provides stunning views and dangerous, serpentine runs. Chamonix offers 145 ski trails and 90 miles of skiable landscape spread over 13 different ski areas. However, off-trail slopes draw the adventurous to Chamonix. More than 30,000 skiable areas constitute the resort's extreme expert-only terrain. Chamonix is also a cosmopolitan busy town with lots of facilities for après ski enjoyment (there are 14 bars and 7 clubs). The skiing in Chamonix attracts the best skiers wanting to challenge themselves, but there are also good beginner pistes for those new to the snow.

**Chamonix Ski Resort** is a collection of five individually enormous ski regions. The **Brevent** and **la Flegere** are the easiest ski areas to access from the center of town. **Les Houches** is the only ski area with slopes below the tree line. **Le Tour** is at the far end of the valley and has many easier slopes for beginners but also some out-of-bounds skiing if you are willing to hike up with your skis. **Les Grand Montets** has the most extreme and highest altitude

slopes. **La Vallee Blanche** is a legendary descent – a jaw-dropping 2,800 vertical metres – is the off-piste ride of a lifetime, which can only be tackled with a guide and takes an entire day. You will also have an option to ski in **Courmayeur, Verbier** and **Megeve**.

**It's not all skiing in Chamonix.** Chamonix's reputation as one of the world's premier skiing destinations also extends to its après ski scene and nightlife with 14 bars and 7 clubs. As a relatively large town with a sizable perennial population, there is nothing contrived and touristy about a night out in Chamonix and there's a seemingly endless choice of different drinking establishments in which to top off yet another epic day on the slopes. While there are bars at the base of each of the different ski areas where you can enjoy an early après beer in the sun, most of the action takes place in town. Fritter away cash at the Casino of Chamonix.

There are more than 280 shops, weekly markets, the Alpine Museum, the Alpine Fauna Museum, crystal gallery and ice grotto, mountain treks, sledging areas, helicopter flights, paragliding, snowmobiling, cable car excursions, snowshoeing, dog sledding, sports center, sauna, Turkish bath, sleigh rides and an ice skating rink.

**Les Aiglons Resort & Spa** – 4\* Hotel located just 200 metres from the Gondola in Chamonix. The hotel boasts one of Chamonix's most beautiful views of Mont Blanc from the lobby or the sunny terrace and its fine restaurant "Le A". Enjoy also its spa, Deep Nature Spa by Algoterm in the heart of the hotel. Experience Alpine well-being with the heated outdoor pool facing Mont Blanc, sauna, hydro jet, steam room with starlit sky, fitness room and relaxation room, not forgetting the five treatment rooms, including one double for shared moments of relaxation.

**Hotel Miramar** – 4\* hotel in Sestri Levante near Cinque Terre right on the beach of the Bay of Silence with all rooms having an inside entrance and outside terraces (ALL with Beach View). The magic of the Baia del Silenzio, the fascination of the carrugi (narrow streets) of the

historic center, the enchanting surroundings: the Hotel Miramare in Sestri Levante is the perfect place for a charming vacation in one of the most elegant marine villages of the Golfo del Tigullio and the Italian Riviera ligure di levante. The Kitchen of the Restaurant Baia del Silenzio, present in the Michelin Guide and prepared by our Chef, is Mediterranean and it's not forgetting the Ligurian tradition, based on the freshest ingredients and seasonal land and sea of the Riviera di Levante.

**Portofino** – Portofino, on the Italian Riviera, is known as the resort of the rich and famous, but there is much

more to see here than just people. Portofino is a picturesque, half-moon shaped seaside village with pastel houses lining the shore of the harbor, shops, restaurants, cafes, and luxury hotels. Castello Brown sits on a hill above the village. You can reach the castle by a path near the Botanic Garden. The castle has a nice garden and has great views of Portofino and the sea. The medieval castle became the residence of Yeats Brown, British consul to Genoa, in 1870.

**Cinque Terre** – You'll find rugged beauty and a slow pace in the Cinque Terre. Named for the five towns of Monterosso, Vernazza, Corniglia, Manarola and Riomaggiore, this portion of the Italian Riviera is a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Cars aren't allowed, so take local trains or ferries to go from town to town—or walk one of the spectacular trails that connect them.

### ATCO TO MARGATE BIKE RIDE 2016

Mark Saturday, June 4 on your calendar as Fall Line makes its annual trek to the shore. This is a leisurely ride (average speed 12-15 mph, but go at your own pace) to Maynard's Café, at 9306 Amherst Ave, in Margate, NJ. Total distance is about 61 miles- 55 miles to Maynard's and an additional 6 miles to the AC Convention Center for the train ride back to Atco. The ride is a great training ride for those contemplating the ACS Bridge to Beach Ride (which is the following weekend) and MS-150 ride in October.

We start at the NJ Transit station in Atco. The parking lot is off of the northbound lanes of Route 73. We begin to arrive around 8 AM for an 8:30 departure. The route goes out Jackson Road to Atsion Rd., down 206, into Hammonton, through scenic Mays Landing past Lake Lenape, Egg Harbor Township, Somers Point, and crosses 2 bridges into Longport before the final push up to Margate. Along the way, we'll stop for breakfast in Hammonton, a quick beverage in Mays Landing and maybe a stop at Dairy Queen in Somers Point. Directions are provided. We hope to have a support vehicle (calling John Steel!! We would be delighted with your presence once again!) for those who decide to take the easy way down. I will ask for a donation from the cyclists to compensate our support drivers for backing us up.

For the trip home, we continue biking up to the Atlantic City rail station at the Convention Center. Cost to return to Atco with your bike is about \$5.00. The trip is asphalt all the way, although most of the riding will be on the shoulders so it may not be all that smooth.
