## **EASTERN PENNSYLVANIA SKI COUNCIL WINTER CARNIVAL AT MT. BACHELOR JANUARY 26, 2019 TO FEBRUARY 2, 2019**

Bend Oregon, it's where you go to play! Life is an adventure, let's take this one together! I've been told that Bend, Oregon is where you go to play. So, bring out the child in you and join us in Mt. Bachelor, Oregon.

Remember when you were in school and you spent your winter evenings in front of the television hoping for a snow day? As a child, few things were more thrilling than a snow day. Well now you can recapture that excitement at Mt. Bachelor. It has a unique landscape, a volcanic cone in the Cascade Mountains. One can head out in any direction to the mountain's circumference of 101 or more trails. Mt. Bachelor has the highest elevation in both Oregon and Washington. The mountain has 10 lifts, seven are Express quads and an average snowfall of over 400 inches. If you want to mellow a bit, check out the Nordic trails for a slower paced version of skiing, or try snowshoeing which is just hiking with tennis racquets strapped to your feet (kind of). Want a break from skiing, go to one of the Sno-Parks, build a snowman, make a snow angel, snowball challenge or grab a toboggan. Let's play!

Our lodging is at The Double Tree, in downtown Bend, located within walking distance to shopping, restaurants and brewpubs. The Double Tree offers a complementary buffet each morning. Fuel up with eggs, potatoes, sausage, bacon or waffles to get started for the day. If soaking your bones is a good way to beat the chill of the snow, the hotel offers 24-hour access to indoor pool. Another option, McMenamins Old St. Francis School, a 1936 Catholic schoolhouse, has a soaking pool surrounded by luminous stained glass and open-air ceiling to check out the evening sky.



If snuggling by a fireplace is your idea of fun, there are dozens of fire pits all over town. Including a collection of them around the Old Mill District. You want to cozy up to a fire and enjoy a pint and a sandwich, then Crux Fermentation Project is the place to go.

If you'd rather warm up from the inside out, try some spice rum from Oregon Spirit Distillers or try Bendistillery's Hazelnut Espresso Vodka with some cocoa and whipped cream.

If your idea of fun is a pint or two with friends, Bend has 14 craft breweries. Discover the Bend Ale Trail, get an Atlas and passport and try each one. There is the Brew bus with Wanderlust Tours, it will pick you up at the hotel, visit three of the breweries with a progressive meal at each stop. Old St. Francis School also has a pub, brewery and on Wednesday evening McMenamins hosts a band that starts at 7:00 PM. Now we are talking adult fun!

On Friday evening many businesses stay open late serving food and wine transforming their venues into mini art galleries. What a nice way to end our week with a stroll through town.

If you have gone to an EPSC Winter Carnival, you'll know there is much more included than in a normal ski trip. There is an EPSC happy hour with drink specials, apes ski party, ski racing; mountain lunch and a farewell reception. This year the theme is Volcanic Confluence Party including Hokulea Dancers and Spinsterz Fire Dancers.

Sign up early on July 17<sup>th</sup> for \$1,829 and save some kala! This price includes 5 day lift tickets. After August 21<sup>st</sup> the price is \$1,904. Hope to see you there. Questions contact me at fedgirl92@gmail.com.

# SÖLDEN, AUSTRIA WITH 4-NIGHT POST-TRIP EXTENSION TO ATHENS, GREECE

## MARCH 8 – 20

Another fabulous Fall Line European adventure awaits! Sölden, a paradise for all winter sports fans, with snow reliability from October to the end of May due not only to its location between 1,350-3,340 meters above sea level and the two glaciers (Rettenbach & Tiefenbach Glacier), but also to the intensive snowmaking of 67% of all pistes. State-of-the-art lifts take you down to 3,340 m, so you can enjoy the extensive downhill runs to the full. From the rustic mountain lodge, to modern self-service restaurants and umbrella bars, all this is provided by the Sölden ski area. With the BIG 3, Sölden is the only ski resort in Austria in which three 3,000 meter lifts are accessible. The viewing platforms of the Gaislachkogel (3,058 m), the Tiefenbachkogel (3,250 m) and the Schwarze Schneid (3,340 m) can be easily reached in the course of the BIG 3 Rally. The new, state-of-the-art Giggijoch mono-rope mountain gondola with 10-person cabins opens up new dimensions when it comes to capacity and modern comfort - by transporting incredible 4500 persons per hour in ultramodern gondola cabins. Thanks to the Gaislachkogel gondola with 8-person cabins (3600 persons/hour) and the new Giggijoch gondola with 10-person cabins (4500 persons/hour) the splendid Sölden Ski Area has the two most powerful feeder mountain gondolas world-wide. Endless sunshine and deep blue skies await you in the gently rolling hills ideal for cross-country skiing and gliding silently through tree-shaded tracks. **007 in Sölden:** The location for the 24th James Bond movie "Specter" was the ski area Sölden. In addition to the action-packed downhill scenes, the glass cube "Ice Q" at the summit of the Gaislachkogel at 3,048 meters above sea level was one of the most important locations.

**Hotel Tyrol** rises directly in the center of Sölden next to the mountain railway and the Freizeit Arena and features a Wellness Center. The hotel features the Whistle Bar which is open from après ski to late in the evening. Or, visit the nearby **Aqua Dome** with its approximately 50,000 square meters area, one of the most modern and architecturally unique thermal landscapes in the Alps. Guests of Hotel Tyrol receive a 10% discount. **Après ski is a top priority in Sölden.**

**ATHENS:** The city with the most glorious history in the world, a city worshipped by gods and people, a magical city. The enchanting capital of Greece has always been a birthplace for civilization. It is the city where democracy was born and most of the wise men of ancient times.



## **ATCO TO MARGATE BIKE RIDE 2018**

Mark Saturday, June 2 on your calendar as Fall Line makes its annual trek to the shore. This is a leisurely ride (average speed 12-15 mph, but go at your own pace) to Maynard's Café, at 9306 Amherst Ave, in Margate, NJ. Total distance is about 61 miles- 55 miles to Maynard's and an additional 6 miles to the AC Convention Center for the train ride back to Atco. The ride is a great training ride for those doing the ACS Ride the following week or the MS Bikeathon in September. Please plan to arrive around 8 AM for an 8:30 departure. The route goes out Jackson Road to Atsion Rd., down 206, into Hammonton, through scenic Mays Landing past Lake Lenape, Egg Harbor Township, Somers Point, and crosses 2 bridges into Longport before the final push up to Margate and then lunch at Maynard's. Along the way, we'll stop for breakfast in Hammonton, a quick beverage in Mays Landing and maybe a stop at Dairy Queen in Somers Point. Directions are provided. We hope to have a support vehicle (calling John Steel!! We would be delighted with your presence once again!). I will ask for a donation from the cyclists to compensate our support drivers for backing us up.

For the trip home, we continue biking up to the Atlantic City rail station at the Convention Center. Cost to return to Atco with your bike is about \$5.00. Trains leave roughly every hour about 45 minutes past the hour (so 2:45, 3:45, 4:45, etc). The trip is asphalt all the way, although most of the riding will be on the shoulders so it may not be all that smooth. Most bikers use road bikes, but I've seen a few hybrids and a mountain bike or two (if you really want to work your legs).
