Vail - Two Seasons In One

A Fall Line favorite brought the 2014 ski season to a close. Though it was still winter as 38 people boarded the bus after arriving in Denver, the thermometer said otherwise: 76 degrees in the sunshine. Hope everyone brought SPF100. Fortunately, by the time we reached the Evergreen Lodge, the temp was more seasonal: 66 degrees. This was going to be a good week.



First night in the Evergreen lobby, we met with one of the ski guides who talked about the layout of the mountain, the village, the best places to eat, best places to rent skis, etc. Turns out he's from New Jersey and he soooooo misses Wawa coffee.

Four of the five days that most of us skied, Vail lived up to its "Blue Bird Day" reputation- brilliant blue skies, little wind and hundreds of acres of untracked corduroy. Vail is such a huge place (over 5000 skiable acres), you could travel to its three main areas in a single day- the Front Side, the Back Bowls, and Blue Sky Basin- and still only ski about five percent of the mountain. My roommate, David Lee and I did just that on the first day and marveled at all the places we didn't ski. We hooked up with Zion Chen and his daughter Katrina, and Gwen Derupo for dinner the second night at a sushi bar. I'd rather take my chances in the Back Bowls during a whiteout than try to eat with chopsticks (I admit it- I'm a sushi virgin). But I persevered, actually liked it and the next day- got my wish- skiing in a

whiteout in the Back Bowls. (Note to anyone skiing with David or Zion in the future- they are hardcore Vail-iacs, not to mention Beaver Creekers, Breckenridgers, Keystoneers, and A-Basiners.)

I hooked up with them in the afternoon as they were leaving the famous Two Elks lodge on top of the ridge and skied with another big Vail fan- John Vetter- who immediately said, "Let's head to Pete's Bowl", an area

at Blue Sky with trails like Lover's Leap, Steep & Deep, Iron Mask and other names that express the not-so-gentle nature of the trails. We avoided them and headed for the open glades under Pete's Express Lift.

By the middle of the week, there were some aching muscles in dire need of some tender loving care (I'm sure Bob Nuss offered his services but most opted for some more skilled hands.) If you're ever at the Evergreen, you can't go wrong with Dutch, a six foot three inch masseur/masseuse who will do his/her best to make all the pain go away. (Or so I was told.)

A fairly large group of us headed out for Italian food at Vendetta's in Vail Village where Steve Umansky gave us a lesson in a couple of not-so-Italian words. I'm not sure how the subject came up, but if anyone ever calls you a "Schlemiel", be grateful you're not a "Schlamazel". ATCO TO MARGATE BIKE RIDE EVENT LEADER: JOHN KENNEDY

Mark June 14 on your calendar as Fall Line makes its annual trek to the shore. This is a leisurely ride to Maynard's Café, at 9306 Amherst Ave, in Margate, NJ.



We've been doing this forever, although the starting and finishing locations have changed, as has the route, the stops and the people who make the ride but, OTHER THAN THAT, it hasn't changed. It's still about 55 miles, it's still a great training ride for those contemplating the ACS and MS-150 rides later in the summer, and it's still not a race (Did I mention this was a leisurely ride, average speed is 12-15 mph).

We start at the NJ Transit station in Atco. The parking lot is off of the northbound lanes of Route 73. We begin to arrive around 8 AM for an 8:30 departure. The route goes out Jackson Road, down 206, into Hammonton, through scenic Mays Landing past Lake Lenape, Egg Harbor Township, Somers Point, and crosses 2 bridges into Longport before the final push up to Margate. Along the

way, we'll stop for breakfast in Hammonton, a quick beverage at Testa's in Mays Landing and maybe a stop at Dairy Queen in Somers Point. Maps are provided. We hope to have a support vehicle (calling John Steel!! We would be delighted with your presence once again!) for those who decide to take the easy way down. I will ask for a donation from the cyclists to compensate our support drivers for backing us up.

For the trip home, we continue biking up to the Atlantic City rail station at the Convention Center. Cost to return to Atco with your bike is about \$5.00. The trip is asphalt all the way, although most of the riding will be on the shoulders so it may not be all that smooth.
