
# POWDER EXPRESS

## VALLEY FORGE BIKE RIDE WITH JOHN KENNEDY

If you haven't put your bikes away for the winter, or better yet, if you haven't taken them out since last winter, how about a leisurely ride through scenic, historic Valley Forge Park. The site of General George Washington's winter camp during the brutal winter of 1777-1778 is actually a beautiful park which should be rolling out some splendid scenery by mid-October. The perimeter of the park is roughly 7 miles and there are paths that criss-cross the interior. You can step inside one of the re-created cabins that Washington's Continental Army used as sleeping/living/eating quarters during the encampment. The cabins, about 10 by 10, usually held 12 men at a time (and you thought your condo was cramped). One of the soldiers, decked out in Revolutionary War garb, will take you back over 230 years and describe the conditions that the soldiers endured while watching out for the British who were camped just 20 miles away in Philadelphia. The Visitors' Center contains the complete history of all of the key events that led to the war, that occurred during the war, and that concluded the war.

The date is Saturday, October 11 and we'll meet at the Visitor's Center at about noon. The park offers guided 2-hour bike tours along the main trail (\$10 per person) or we can just tour the park on our own.

If you've never been to the Park, it's hilly so a road bike is recommended (although if you like a challenge, bring a mountain or hybrid.) If you really want a challenge, you can start the day at the unofficial start of the Schuylkill River bike trail, around 25<sup>th</sup> and Locust St. The route to the park is about 22 miles and takes you past the Art Museum, Boat-house Row, and into Manayunk. From there, we jump onto the canal path at the Manayunk Brewery and bike through Spring Mill, Conshohocken, and Norristown before turning off the trail to Valley Forge. You'll be on a paved trail along the river all the way (except for a short stretch at Manayunk). Keep in mind, if you want to do this, your total mileage will be around 50.



If you want to ride just through the park, meet at the Visitor's Center at noon (lower level near the main doors). If you want to do the entire trail, I will be at 25<sup>th</sup> & Locust around 10 AM or you can meet us

at Lloyd Hall around 10:15 (Lloyd Hall is the first building behind the Art Museum along Boathouse Row).



**GOOD NEWS!!!** Vail Resorts has acquired Park City Mountain Resort (PCMR) for \$182.5 Million. The announcement was made on Thursday, September 11<sup>th</sup> after three years of litigation between PCMR and its landlord (that also leases the Canyons to Vail).

This means that if you have the EPIC PASS and are already scheduled for the Park City trip with Fall Line then you will NOT have to pay additional for lift tickets!!

Also, Fall Line's Breckenridge, Tahoe and Park City trips are all traveling to Vail owned ski areas where the EPIC PASS is valid. If you are traveling on more than one of these trips you should check into getting the EPIC PASS (<http://www.snow.com/epic-pass.aspx>) since it could save you lots of money!

## HIKE AT RIDLEY CREEK STATE PARK NEWTOWN SQUARE, PA



Ridley Creek State Park is a beautiful area encompassing over 2,606 acres of Delaware County woodlands and meadows. The gently rolling terrain of the park, bisected by Ridley Creek, is only 16 miles from center city Philadelphia and is an oasis of open space in a growing urban area.

Hunting Hill Mansion at Ridley Creek State Park is a large English-Tudor style mansion-house. In 1914, the Jeffords family added on to the original 1789 Pennsylvania stone farmhouse. The gray stone facade is repeated on structures throughout the park.

We will meet at 10:30 am On October 18th in the parking lot close to the Mansion. There are several picnic tables so be sure to bring your lunch and something to share. After the hike we can enjoy our meal together.
