Fishtown, 1210 Frankford Avenue. Located in the heart of Fishtown, Frankford Hall is probably the most authentic-feeling beer garden in town, with indoor and outdoor seating for more than 400, multiple bars, an abundance of picnic tables, and games ranging from Jenga to ping pong. Effectively, the space is usable year-round with the help of more than a dozen heat lamps, a couple fire pits and an overhead heating system. Classic German foods (think pretzels, bratwurst) plus burgers are available at a walk-up counter, as is a hefty beer menu that includes everything from traditional German beers to craft specialties.

On October 15th, let's meet in Burlington City, NJ for a good old-fashioned Pub Crawl, with a Brewery thrown in for good measure!

At 2pm, we will meet at Brickwall Tavern and Dining Room, located at 19 East Union Street. This was once the old Union Street Firehouse, that has been converted into the latest hot spot of Burlington City. They have plenty of parking, munchies, Craft Beer and a full bar to get the day started.

After a few we can head around the corner to Legends Pizza and Tap, located at 318 High Street. Just as the name claims, their pizza is legendary, where they offer speciality pizzas, as well as create your own. They also offer a wide variety of tap and bottled beer, as well as a full bar with many drink options.

Next stop is the Third State Brewing Company, just a few doors down from Legends, at 352 High Street. Third State has nine beers, so we are sure you will find at least one to enjoy. They have three different IPA's, two kinds of Porter, a Saison and a Blonde Ale. They also offer flights, if you would like to try several. Third State does not offer food, but it is a BYOF, also the only thing they serve is beer, no full bar, sorry.

The final stop of our adventure is Geraghty's Pub, which is a few blocks away at 148 West Broad Street. Geraghty's offers burgers, fish and chips, several types of steak sandwiches, salads and many appetizers. They also have over 60 beers to select from, including many craft and bottle beers, as well as a full bar got those who prefer wine or mixed drinks.

FYI – all of these Pubs are very close to the Burlington Towne Center train station on the River Line.
