

SUPER BOWL SUNDAY (RIVER) 2016 RIGHT AT PEAK SNOW SEASON!!!!



Save the dates: February 5-8, Fall Line invades the beautiful Maine resort of Sunday River on Super Bowl Weekend. With any luck (okay, a lot of luck- alright, a miracle), the Eagles will be on display like they were in 2005 and we will be watching them. This is a 3-day ski trip that includes lodging at the Snow Cap Inn (within walking distance to the lifts, but there are free shuttles to the lifts), continental breakfast, 3-day lift ticket.

It's been a while so if you're not familiar with Sunday River, it ain't Kansas, Auntie Em. Actually there are trails called Kansas, Emerald City, Flying Monkey, Tin Woodsman, and Cowardly Lion all in Oz which is one of 8 peaks at Sunday River. The resort features 2,340 feet of vertical, 135 trails, 15 lifts, 870 skiable acres spanning 3 miles - and 92% snowmaking. There are trails for all levels. If you "think" you're an expert, try White Heat, Shockwave or Chutzpah; if you're into cruising, there's Lollapoluzza, T2, or Sunday Punch. If you're into easier trails, there's Cowardly Lion and the misleadingly-named Cyclone (really only a breeze). There are restaurants at all the bases as well as on the mountain. In addition, we're throwing a Fall Line Super Bowl party.

We will be staying at the Snow Cap Inn, a cozy, rustic Inn about a nine minute walk from the White Cap base area. Free shuttles to the lifts are available as well for those who do not want to walk. The Inn features queen size beds, complimentary wi-fi, an outdoor hot tub, and

ski lockers. Nearby bars and restaurants abound. Want a decadent breakfast? Try Grand Avenue or the Northern Lights Cafe in the Jordan Hotel or CAMP in the Grand Summit. For apres ski, enjoy Sliders in the Jordan off the Lollapoluzza trail or The Foggy Goggle in the South Ridge Lodge or The Shipyard Brew Haus in the White Cap Lodge (open for brunch on weekends with \$4 Bloodies.)

- 3 nights hotel accommodations (2 per room) at the Snow Cap Inn
- 3 complimentary Perfect Turn clinics

Sunday River opens on September 15 at the early sign-up price of \$569 which is a great price for peak snow season.



Killington

Fall Line is going to Killington, Vermont on the weekend of **January 8-10**.



Killington has 155 trails, 22 lifts including two 8-passenger gondolas, and 1,509 acres extending across six interconnected mountain peaks.

Killington averages 250 inches of natural snow each winter and has a snowmaking system that covers 71% of the trails. The main peak, Killington Peak, has the second greatest vertical drop in the east (3,050 ft.). Ski trails are 28% beginner, 33% intermediate and 39% expert. Personal favorites include Devil's Fiddle, Outer Limits, Cascade, Lower Ovation, and Superstar. Beginners should give Juggernaut a try. It's the longest trail in the eastern U.S. at 6.2-miles. Intermediate skiers should head over to the glades for some less crowded skiing. There are also five snowboard and alpine parks.

Relax for lunch at the Roaring Brook Umbrella Bar near the Superstar Quad, or enjoy the fantastic views at Killington's new Peak Lodge. Lifts stop running at 4:30. You can finish the day at the K-1 Lodge, listen to live music, and enjoy a Long Trail, Otter Creek or a Magic Hat.

We will be staying at the **Killington Mountain Lodge** (formerly the Inn of the Six Mountains), right on the access road. The Lodge has recently been purchased and is **undergoing extensive renovations** (rooms, beds, carpeting, TVs, kitchen, pool, hot tub, lobby, etc.) by the new owners. There is a great complimentary hot buffet breakfast each morning. Wireless internet in public areas and complimentary computer use in the lobby. Cedars Restaurant is located in the Lodge. The Lodge provides complimentary shuttle service right to the mountain.

Night life at Killington is awesome. There are shuttles running up and down the access roads to all the other hotels, bars and restaurants. Looking for some good food, head out to The Foundry (formerly the Grist Mill), the Wobly Barn Steakhouse, Santa Fe Steakhouse, or Choices Restaurant. Stop by the Lookout Bar & Grill, Mogul's Sports

Pub, or Jax for some typical bar food. Charity's, Garlic, Baja Burrito, or Sushi Yoshi are also good choices. I've eaten in all of them. After a night of partying you may want to head over to the Outback for some pizza and live music.

The trip includes round trip motor coach from Mt. Laurel to Killington with beer, wine, and soda included, 2 nights lodging at The Inn (double occupancy), and 2-day lift ticket. **Killington opens on September 15 at the early sign-up price of \$389.**


